Key Construction Activities

Demolition and TSE

Works conducted at the following sites are summarised below:

Chatswood:

- Installation of shade cloth and upgrading fencing
- > Structural demolition of existing buildings and removal of materials
- Installation of hoarding and scaffolding
- Removal of trees and trimming vegetation
- Service investigation works
- High voltage and low voltage works
- Visual inspections, drilling for geotechnical investigations, heritage investigations and soil testing within the site and in Gordon Avenue
- ➤ Decommissioning of substation which was located at the southern end of the site near Mowbray Road conducted under an approved out of hours work on 23-24 August 2017.

Crows Nest:

- Established site amenities including site offices,
- All buildings visual inspections, surveys, drilling for geotechnical investigations and soil testing within the site, established environmental and safety controls, service investigation works, disconnecting building services and established temporary service connections such as water and electricity, removal of internal fixtures and fittings, safe removal of internal hazardous materials using a licensed contractor, installation of fencing and scaffolding at the perimeter of the site and minor construction activities to prepare buildings for demolition.
- Capping of contaminated ground using a licensed contractor at 477-495 Pacific Highway
- ➤ Hoarding works and removal of awnings commenced during the last week of August 2017.

Victoria Cross:

- Removal of hazardous materials using a licensed contractor, removal of internal fixtures and fittings (soft strip out), installation of hoarding and site fencing around the perimeter of the site, installation of scaffold around the buildings, minor construction activities to prepare buildings for demolition.
- ➤ Lifting equipment and plant to the rooftop of 181 Miller Street building using a mobile crane located in the Tower Square area, and installation of an external hoist lift to allow workers access to upper floors at 181 Miller Street.
- Ongoing structural demolition of existing buildings at 155, 181 and 187 Miller Street
- ➤ Hoarding installation commenced on Berry Street 28 August 2017 under an approved out of hours work application.

Pitt Street:

- Commencement of demolition works in the plant room floor of 175 Castlereagh Street.
- Ongoing removal of internal fixtures and fittings (soft strip out), installation of scaffolding around the site, installation of an external hoist lift to allow workers access to upper floors, service investigation works, structural demolition works and removal of materials at 175 Castlereagh Street.
- Out of hours works were also conducted at 175 Castlereagh Street for service investigation works, deliveries of plant and equipment, using a crane to lift and lower plant and equipment to upper floors, safely removal of hazardous materials using a licensed contractor.

- Conducting geotechnical investigations at Park Street.
- Additional crane mobilisation works at 175 Castlereagh Street was also undertaken under approved out of hours work.

Martin Place:

- Removal of hazardous materials using a licensed contractor, removal of internal fixtures and fittings, Installation scaffolding around the site, minor construction activities to prepare buildings for demolition.
- Established a load out zone for trucks and internal demolition works and removal of materials at 8-12 Castlereagh Street, 7 Elizabeth Street, and 55 Hunter Street.
- Installation of an external hoist lift to allow workers access to upper floors and structural demolition of the existing building at 55 Hunter Street.
- ➤ Hoarding works within the perimeter of the s at 8-12 Castlereagh Street, 55 Hunter Street and 7 Elizabeth Street including minor structural work, painting and installing lights.
- Removal of heritage items from the site and transported to a storage facility in Roseberry for safekeeping that involves trucks accessing the site via Elizabeth Street.

Waterloo:

- > Drilling for geotechnical investigations and soil testing within the site, established environmental and safety controls, removal of internal fixtures and fittings (soft strip out), removal of hazardous materials using a licensed contractor.
- Bundling overhead power cables at Cope Street.
- Out of hours works were conducted:
 - o Raglan Street and Cope Street bundling of overhead power cables.

Marrickville:

- soil testing within the site, upgrading power lines and augmentation to power poles, substation decommissioning and electrical redistribution works, demolishing existing buildings, conducting service investigation works
- Out of hours work conducted at 2-30 Edinburgh Road and 5-15 Murray Street for overhead power cables work and replacement of power poles.
- ➤ Utility investigation Saywell and Shirlow Streets

ER Inspections

Demolition and TSE

Weekly inspections continued under the management of the TSE contractor for the demolition sites. It is anticipated that generally each site will be inspected every second week at this stage of the project.

ER Inspection reports have been prepared and issued to Sydney Metro and TSE Contractor. Actions identified during inspections related to ERSED controls; dust management; storage of fuels and chemicals and implementation of monitoring actions required within the CEMP. These actions were assessed as minor and have been closed out during subsequent inspections.

In previous months and at the commencement of the month there had been changes of the Delta

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Environmental Manager with inconsistent approaches being observed in respect of implementing Delta CEMP administrative requirements. This was a focus during ER site inspections in the month and inspections near the end of the month noted improvements in the surveillance of Delta work sites by the Delta Environment Manager.

Demolition	The following complaints were received at the following sites:			
	 Marrickville – Three (3) complaints were received regarding dust on 18/08/17, 28/8/17 and 29/8/17. Crows Nest – Two (2) complaints were raised regarding asbestos removal works (25/8/17); and noise from OOHWs (28/8/17). Waterloo – one (1) compliant was raised on regarding security - glass and building fragments found on church, identified to be from vandalism and not project works (18/8/17). Victoria Cross – Four (4) complaints were raised regarding crane activity (2/8/17); piece of wire found at the childcare centre balcony (11/8/17); debris found on childcare centre balcony (16/8/17); and noise during standard hours (17/8/17). One night time complaint was received that was not project related. Pitt Street – One (1) complaint regarding traffic during scaffolding removal on 13/8/17. Martin Place – One (1) complaint related to property damaged (found not to be project related). 			
	 Chatswood – Two (2) complaints from out of hours works during the night on 9/8/17; and vibration during day works on 11/8/17. 			
	All complaints were addressed and closed out or actions defined.			
	The TSE Contractor reported that a truck impacted the awning of the Castlereagh Boutique Hotel (adjacent the Pitt Street site) in early August resulting in slight damage to one corner of the awning. The TSE Contractor reported that the Heritage Consultant and TSE Contractor reviewed the damage; obtained a number of quotes for the repair of the awning and had initiated the process to procure services to repair the damage.			
	There were no incidents as defined by the project approval definition for incidents reported or observed by the ER during the period or reported to DPE under condition A41.			
	Sydney Metro has been communicating with DPE regarding the type of documents required to be placed on the project website. A number of new documents have been added to the website during the reporting period as required by Condition B15.
