Line Wide

For **SMTF North**, the key issues observed/discussed were:

- Landscape planting completed in Snake Mountain and SMTF Expansion Area
- Some tree plantings adjacent to the northern boundary fence of Snake Mountain and ground cover in the SMTF Expansion area (near signalling building) alongside the road have not established. ER requested evidence of SC's process in managing above through the landscaping and maintenance contract or through a defect register process (or similar).
- Water cart mobilised and noted during inspection, for dust management
- Section of Snake Mountain has been ripped and manually seeded as part of site stabilisation works establishment of grass cover to be monitored ongoing
- Weed control undertaken, adjacent to southern side of the Maintenance Shed.

For Northern Hub (Incorporating Chatswood Dive Site, Northern Connection and Hopetoun Ave), Cleland Road Site, Cleland Road Ancillary Site, Blues Point Access Site, Artarmon TSS, and St Leonards Storage Area the key issues observed/discussed were:

Northern Hub

- Chatswood Dive Pre-Start Area positive Housekeeping message and requirements displayed in Pre-Start Area
- Chatswood Dive Site Water cart/sweeper had been used in the yard and external areas were

observed to be generally tidy.

- Minor housekeeping items: eg: Some hydraulic oil cans in Mechanical Maintenance Shed were observed to have no secondary containment; lined bin for concrete waste was observed to contain some rubbish
- Concrete delivery site at Hopetoun Avenue was inspected and observed to be generally tidy.
- WTP filter cake (classified as GSW) was contained and not overfilled in storage area. Ongoing
 monitoring required ensuring that the storage area does not exceed capacity.
- Concrete spillage observed on ground in Piling Area (Western and Eastern Walls). SC confirmed that during concrete pours of piles, a blockage had occurred in the concrete line pump warranting unblocking of the line and that clean up was scheduled that afternoon (i.e. 18th May 21). Action raised for removal of concrete and clean-up.
- Concrete delivery site at Hopetoun Avenue was inspected and observed to be generally tidy no deliveries observed.

Cleland Road Site

- New project shade cloth installed by SC, replacing sections of older shade cloth observed to have graffiti facing rail corridor and within site compound (raised previously as an action).
- Project signage (raised previously as an action) was installed on Access Gate by SC.
 Artarmon TSS site
- Ongoing trenching and CSR works along footpath adjacent to Whiting Street including spoil load out had appropriate controls in place – geofabric covering spoil that had been excavated, timber boards covering sections of trench that had been excavated and ERSED controls around kerb drains
- Floccing in progress, within lined bins

Valetta Lane Access

No graffiti observed on shade cloth around access gate and fence.

Blues Point Access Site

- Rumble grid in place at site entry/exit and road at site entrance. No evidence of tracking observed. Minor oil sheen observed on wet surface within site and source not evident. Discussion held on-site with Site Supervisor to address using absorbent pad. Contractor re-inspected area and confirmed no recurrence of oil sheen.
- SC confirmed all water from site captured within Project's Water Treatment Plant.

Civil and Track Work Areas (South) the key issues discussed were:

Campsie TSS

- Accumulated rainfall run-off in trench/ excavated area pumped to holding tank at Campsie TSS for treatment and testing, prior to discharge via Discharge Permit process. Sediment fence in place along boundary
- Removal of asbestos material from Campsie TSS site, using a specialist contractor and load-out.
 Flagging and signage onsite and across site gate. SC reported Hygienist and air monitoring on-site
 Southern Dive & SMTF South Marrickville
- Piling works completed for SMTF S Administration Building. Piling for remaining buildings planned to commence in next couple weeks. Action raised for tonal alarm on Piling Rig to be swapped-out for non-tonal alarm.
- Piling material stockpiled in area. SC confirmed no contamination encountered during piling work.
- WTP components from Crows Nest observed on-site with set up and commissioning planned post handover from TSE. Handover of TSE Areas expected to occur on 26th May.
- Concrete wash-out into skip bins available for concrete agitator trucks delivering to Southern Dive track slab pour.
- Some dirt tracking from SC controlled site gate (11th May) to Sydney Steel Road, Marrickville. SC
 Supervisor advised that street sweeper will be deployed prior to end of shift.
- Sediment controls are in place around kerb drain and pit behind Site Offices. Maintenance required by removal of sediment/dirt accumulated near kerb drain on Sydney Steel Road and near pit and surrounds, behind Site

For **Bulk Power Supply Work Areas (South)** the key issues discussed were:

• Frog Hollow Reserve Site (11th May) - Maintenance required by removal of sediment accumulated behind sediment fence at Frog Hollow Reserve, and sediment amongst road plates and kerb line on

Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

Line Wide

Two non-compliances were reported to the ER during the reporting period in relation to 2 complaints received on 17th and 25th May at Blues Point (discussed further below under "Complaints").

LW North:

- 17/05/21 Blues Point Access Site- Resident complained about heavy vehicle movements outside of the hours permitting heavy vehicle movements (prior to 7 am), supplying an image of a truck taken at 5:20am. SC investigated the cause and was advised that the vehicle was transporting a crane as a matter of urgency to replace an existing crane that was undergoing maintenance. SC emailed the stakeholder to apologise for the disturbance and advise of the investigation outcome.
- 25/05/21 Blues Point Access Site- Resident complained about alleged continued heavy vehicle movement breaches of standard construction hours. Complainant's email stated that on 25th May at 6:35am, 2 heavy vehicles (one being a mobile crane) had made their way onto the site along Blues Point Road. SC investigated the cause and was advised that the vehicles were scheduled to arrive on site during standard construction hours. The vehicles had departed the Contractor's depot and arrived on site earlier than expected, due to less road traffic. SC emailed the complainant to apologise for the repeat disturbance, advise of the investigation outcome and corrective action.
- 25/05/21 Noise complaint- Artarmon Noise complaint was found to not be related to SC works LW South

04/05/21 Surry Hills – Noise. Unrelated OOH works at Chalmers St.

- 12/05/21 Surry Hills (BPS) Noise: Stakeholder advised that noise was waking him up but could not or would not specify the type of noise or what was creating it. SC confirmed road plates were being laid at the time of the call. Noise monitoring was undertaken on the night of 11th May and indicated noise was below predicted levels. SM complaints process in place to respond to this stakeholder.
- 16/05/21 Surry Hills (BPS) Noise: Stakeholder reported excessive noise from Randle Lane, especially during night work. SC investigated complaint and noise monitoring confirmed that work was being carried out within approved limits for this activity. Respite offer (RO) was sent to property in mid-April. Stakeholder was advised that only one night of work remained. RO re-sent for remaining work period.
