## **ER Inspections**

#### Line Wide

As a result of the current Covid 19 situation in NSW (i.e. Construction Pause and then recommencement with stringent Covid 19 requirements), no inspections were conducted by the ER in August 2021. System Connect (SC), the Line Wide Works Contractor conducted four internal environmental inspections across the LW worksites in lieu of ER inspections. The following minor actions were raised by SC:

## Southern Sites:

■ 12/08/21 – SMTF – S Marrickville - Sandbags protecting drain on Sydney Steel Road are damaged and require replacement.

#### Northern Sites:

- 12/08/21 SMTF N Hazardous chemicals stored in bunded container, cabinet or on spill pallets. Action raised for bund below generator at PS2 area to be de-watered.
- 27/08/21 Chatswood Dive Site Action raised to fix small leak from refuelling dispenser nozzle.
- 30/08/21-SMTF N- Drainage swales near main site compound will need cleaning as part of site demobilisation.

Minor actions were raised for the above with action close-out in progress by SC or close-out provided via photographic evidence to the ER, as requested by the ER.

## Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

## Line Wide

## LW North Complaints (excluding worker behaviour complaints):

- Blues Point Light Spill 5/8/21 The resident called to complain of bright lights shining through caller's property. Resident requested the lights be switched off or dimmed.
- Blues Point –OOH Noise -10/8/21 The resident called to complain about excessive OOH noise from tunnel access site between 6<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Aug.
- Surry Hills BPS-Property Damage 24/8/21-Complaint Caller making representations on behalf of tenant at the property regarding power supply night works. Tenant had reporting crack in a wall, after night works have begun.
- Blues Point 27/8/21- Resident emailed to complain about the alleged loud hammering like noise coming from Blues Point tunnel access site on Friday morning at 01:00 AM. Complainant stated that the issue caused major disturbance and that he was unable to sleep.

Below complaints related to Surry Hills Power Upgrade Works, with SC investigation and resolution summarised following complaints listed:

- Surry Hills Noise OOHW-28/8/21 Resident expressed frustration at noise levels, stated he could not sleep at night.
- Surry Hills Noise / flashing lights OOHW 28/8/21 Resident contacted the team about the high noise levels from drilling, digging, construction and flashing lights for the past two nights and unable to sleep.
- Surry Hills Noise OOHW -27/8/21 Resident contacted the team about the high noise levels during the work.
- Surry Hills Noise / Water disconnection OOHW 29/8/21- Resident expressed frustration at noise from last few nights and disconnection of water on Saturday morning.
- Surry Hills Noise OOHW 29/8/21- Resident emailed to say he was unable to sleep the previous night due to noise from the construction work.
- Surry Hills- Noise OOHW 30/8/21—Resident complained about noise from construction work being louder and that it had gone on for longer than expected, would like to reconsider respite options.
   Complainant initially had declined the offer.
- Surry Hills Noise OOHW- 27/8/21 Resident concerned about noise from work, requesting relocation.
- Surry Hills Noise OOHW 29/8/21 Resident called about the high noise levels for past few nights and requested a callback to discuss the respite options for previous and remaining nights.
- Surry Hills- Noise OOHW -30/8/21 Complainant a dvised that they would like to speak to someone about the works occurring outside their property, as it was noisy at times. Complainant called Sydney Metro the day before the complaint was forwarded to the engagement inbox (at 4pm on 29/08).
- Surry Hills Noise OOHW 30/08/21 Resident called about the high noise levels he was experiencing
  over the past few nights and requested a call backto discuss respite options for previous nights and the
  remaining nights.

SC's investigation and resolution for above complaints: SC's Stakeholder Advisor contacted the complainants and a pologised for the inconvenience. Confirmed work was ongoing on site and noise monitoring that had been completed indicated that noise levels were less than predicted. However, there was a change in methodology due to services not being located as expected. Emergency work notification distributed within two hours of emergency workstarting. Complainants were offered options which included AA or respite vouchers; with these residents taking up either one or a combination of both options offered.

Surry Hills- Noise/dust - 31/8/21 – Resident complained about the noise, dust, alleged workers were not wearing mask and that the site hoarding inadequately securing the construction materials onsite.
Resident requested a copy of CEMP to understand what guidelines were being followed. Further investigation completed by SC and response provided to complainant regarding controls on-site and a copy of CEMP was provided.

## **LW South Complaints:**

Nil

There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256. The following minor (class 3) incidents were recorded:

LW North: Surry Hills BPS- 28 Aug 21 - While undertaking BPS works adjacent to the Sydney Water Main (SWM), a rock fell from a bucket of an excavator and fell on top of an exposed underground Sydney Water, water main, which damaged and broke the steel pipe leading to water gushing from the broken pipe. Work crew immediately stopped work and notified Sydney Water of the damage. The bucket of the machine was placed over the damaged water main to shield the water flow vertically. Sydney Water arrived on site and shut down Stop valves close by. Damaged pipe was then repaired. Clean potable water flowed onto the road surface, which was clean, and then into the street stormwater drainage system. Water also collected in the open trench. That water, having mixed with sediment, was collected and removed by vacuum truck for off-site disposal and treatment.
