ER Inspections

SSJ

There were two inspections conducted by the ER in September 2021 (14/09/21 & 28/09/2021) with COVID-19 restrictions in place. The key issues raised were:

- Graffiti was observed in a number of locations, including Sydenham Pit Pump House and confluence structure
- Sediment in the gutter and maintenance of ERSED controls, including the rumble grid at Garden Street.
- General waste management at the Bedwin Road Bridge (Edgeware Road) site.
- Parking within tree dripline (responsibility to be confirmed) on Edgeware Road.
- A box containing what appeared to be fragments of asbestos-cement sheeting was observed outside the Linewide SMTF site hoarding. It was likely the asbestos had been dumped and not associated with the project.

Actions were raised for the above issues, and all actions were in the process of being closed-out by JHLOR.

ER Inspections

Line Wide As a result of the current Covid 19 situation in NSW (i.e. Construction Pause and then recommencement with stringent Covid 19 requirements), no inspections were conducted by the ER in September 2021.

System Connect (SC), the Line Wide Works Contractor conducted four internal environmental inspections across the LW worksites in lieu of ER inspections. The following minor actions were raised by SC with action close-out in progress or close-out provided via photographic evidence to the ER:

Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

Line Wide

LW North Complaints (excluding safety related complaint):

- 2/09/2021- Surry Hills OOH noise & vibration Resident called about the high noise levels over last few
 days and further noise heard this morning 02/09 at 8am. He requested a call back to discuss if there are
 any respite offer available for him and his housemates for the last few days of disruption.
- 10/09/2021 Blues Point Traffic, Transport & Parking- Resident had emailed North Sydney Council in relation to parking at Blues Point - workers parking on Blues Point Rd, making it harder for resident to find parking.
- 13/09/2021 Northern Connection Noise & Vibration —OOHW-Notification of work Resident complained of not receiving notice of out of hours work (which kept them awake).
- 14/09/2021 Marrickville Dive Site and SMTF South Noise & Vibration -Standard hours- Resident complained about the noise levels causing disruption while working from home and requested if the noise levels could be reduced.
- 17/09/2021 Chatswood Dive Site Noise & Vibration –OOHW resident complained about excessive noise occurring at the Chatswood Dive site. The resident described the noise as steel banging and clanging as well as vehicles beeping and using compression breaks.
- 17/09/2021 Chatswood Dive Site Noise & Vibration –OOHW- resident complained about noise disturbance; there was excessive noise occurring at the Chatswood Dive site (still going at 11pm) as well as flood lighting. The resident described the noise as steel banging and clanging as well as vehicles beeping and using compression breaks.
- 18/09/2021 Northern Connection/ Chatswood Dive Site Noise & Vibration –OOHW Caller advised that there was a lot of vibrations and noise coming from the work site yesterday morning but stated that she was not provided notice about the works occurring and asked why alternative accommodation had not been offered.
- 30/09/2021 Blues Point A resident at Blues Point has called in to complain about a Bingo truck idling opposite her house for 30 minutes at a time from 10 August 2021. Before getting in contact with SM call centre, she called Bingo directly and did not receive a satisfactory response. The complaint is still under investigation by the Contractor and further detail will be provided, as applicable.

LW South Complaints:

 9/09/2021 – Canterbury substation - Noise & Vibration - Standard hours - Resident emailed about the high noise levels being experienced during rock breaking at Hutton Street during substation construction.

There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256. The following minor (class 3) incidents were recorded; noting first incident recorded below was not

included in the previous Monthly Report and has been included for completeness within this Monthly Report: LW North:

- INC 029- 31/08/21 SMTF S Marrickville A posi track has dripped hydraulic oil (approximately <2L) whilst operating on the surface in the north-eastern portion of site. Spill kits deployed to clean up the dripped hydraulic oil from a damaged hydraulic hose.
- INC 031 09/09/2021- Chatswood Dive area A hydraulic hose leak was noticed on 14t excavator in dive excavation area. Less than 2L of oil has dripped from the machine to ground. Spill kit contents were immediately deployed and a drip tray placed under the machine.
- INC 032 13/09/2021- Blues Point Whilst in the process of transferring diesel fuel from the main fuel storage tank on-site to the smaller diesel 1000lt fuel pod, the worker was called away to complete another task (took longer than anticipated). On returning to the fuel pod the worker found that approximately 150-200lts of diesel had spilled onto the concrete hard stand area. No diesel made it into the surface sumps feeding to the WTP and corrective actions were implemented.

LW South:

■ INC 033 – 23/09/2021- Cup and Saucer (CAS) Creek, Earlwood –Towards the end of the concrete pour for the two piles and blinding layer on the Ausgrid side of CAS Creek, concrete slurry was noticed to have started seeping though the bottom of the channel wall (brick wall) into the concrete-lined channel. When seepage was noticed, <5 L of concrete slurry had entered the CAS Creek channel. Controls were immediately deployed and corrective actions implemented. Due to the low flow state of the creek and the slow seepage pace of concrete slurry, approximately 1 L of concrete slurry entered the waterway before corrective actions implemented on-site.

One non-compliance at Campsie TSS recorded for the reporting period. Detail below: LW South:

■ NCR 007 (CoA E20 – SSI 8256) – 10/9/21 - Campsie TSS – SC undertook a scheduled concrete pour (150 m3) at Campsie TSS with completion planned in standard working hours. The concreting work was delayed due to the late arrival of the independent concrete quality tester; which resulted in several of the initial truck deliveries being rejected (no tester and concrete not complying with mix design) and caused a delay of approximately three hours. The Construction Team notified SC's Enviro Team that the concrete pour was running behind schedule with concrete finishing activities requiring extension beyond 6 pm. SC was of the view that the concreting work needed to be completed so as to avoid creating defective and damaged property of what was being constructed, and as such constituted Emergency Work under CoA E20 and proceeded in accordance with CoA E21 with letter box notifications provided to nearby affected residential receive. An NCR was then raised post further discussions with SM and ER.
