Key Construction Activities During the Period

Works conducted during the reporting period included:

- Excavating platform surface and retiling the northern and middle end of Platform 1
- Installing new services within the Eastern Suburbs Railway (ESR) Concourse and within the 'ghost platforms',
 which will include moving and delivering materials to and around station
- Diverting and removing existing services cables and installing new services cables in pedestrian tunnels, upper and lower Northern Concourse, ESR Concourse and Southern Concourse
- Installing services within the rail corridor, near Lee Street substation, Darling Harbour Goods Line and Mortuary Station, and in the Railway Institute Driveway
- Demolishing, scaffolding and concreting works within, and at the entry to an existing services room on the
- western side of the Eddy Avenue forecourt
- Restoration works to the Central Electric Building station entrance on the Eddy Avenue forecourt
- Delivering materials, services investigations, services diversions and relocations, surveying, monitoring around the station and using pedestrian tunnels.
 - Metro Box Truck movements; metro box ventilation. Ongoing construction activities for the Chillers and Ventilation Building. Ongoing installation of platform Canopies. Fit out of the Platform and other levels. Various FRP works. Completion of drilling for CSR bores. Installation of new groundwater system in area of former gasworks annulus. Working on top of the Metro box and in the yard for reinstatement of Tracks 13-14 including laying ballast, building overhead wire structures, installing drainage and new tracks, and working on the new canopies.
- On the upper Northern Concourse, glazing, hoarding changes and removal, tiling, and finishing works.
- Releveling and tiling Platforms 12-13.
- Central Walk Excavating for Central Walk complete for escalator voids. FRP works for columns, shotcreting. Fit out
 of escalators and facier panels.
- Works within hoarded work zones on suburban Platforms 16-23 and platform surface excavation during rail possession weekends.
- Sydney Yard Water Treatment Plant Operation; truck access; laydown. Former stockpiling area being used for track assembly. Delivery of OSOM for station canopies ongoing.
- Northern Concourse Ongoing fit out works at intersection of Northern Concourse and Metro Box area.
- Eastern Entrance FRP for walls; floor slabs and columns inside the shaft. Works up to ground level.
- Devonshire Street Tunnel- In operation and used by commuters.
- CSR works Rail Institute Compound area to support drilling of bores for CSR between Ghost Platform and Metro Box still being demobilised after completion of drilling works.
- ESR Concourse Ongoing use of the area for laydown and construction support. Fit out and other construction activities ongoing.
- Ongoing construction of works related to the Eddy Av fire booster pump.
- Ghost Platforms (above ESR Platforms 24-25) Ongoing electrical and other fit out.
- Possession during 26-30 December as well as other weekends in December.

Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

- Ongoing activities as described above
- OSOM deliveries continuing
- Ongoing planning for works in Randle Lane for the HV connection.


ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections (01/12/2021 and 15/12/2021) conducted during the reporting period. The key issues raised were:

- Various drums were observed to be stored in areas without immediate secondary containment including: IBCs outside
 the bund at the WTP; Two 205 L drums on at the Metro Box; and A 20L drum in the Yard laydown area.
- Workers were smoking while seated in chairs outside the crib room on Chalmers Street recently approved as a minor ancillary facility. The ancillary facility approval does not allow for a smoking area in the public walkway. This was discussed at the time of the inspection for immediate action.
- Sydney Yard: The assembly area the area of the previous stockpile area had not been cleaned or re-surfaced, and

hence is a potential source of dust in dry weather or turbidity in run-off in wet weather. LOR to consider how the area may be treated to reduce the potential for dust generation or turbidity in runoff.

Key Construction Activities During the Period

HBI

- Fraser Park Ancillary Facility: Demobilisation commenced including removal of sites sheds, generators, storage containers and amenities.
- CSR Laydown Area: Materials storage; Awaiting remaining GST and security fencing.
- Geotechnical Office Area: No active works; Awaiting completion of fencing in the southern corner of the site.
- Sydenham Station / Development Area: Spoil load out to Gateway Project from the Development Area complete. Demolition of concrete slab and asphalt layer. Low blockwork wall commenced between the site and adjacent industrial property.
- Secondary Plaza: Asphalting of the secondary plaza complete; TSOM site compound established.
- Sydenham Road: Works complete and landscaping established. Site hoarding remained.
- 11 Sydenham Road (including Garden Street): Heavy vehicle ramp demolished. Asphalt removed from the Garden Street access. Installation of security fencing continued along rail line.
- Sydenham Pit and Pumping Station / Confluence Area: Backfill of the high voltage (HV) pit adjacent to Retaining Wall 4 (RW4) commenced. GST planned to continue once the HV pit has been backfilled. Pumping Station handed back to Sydney Water, including responsibility for pump operation; to be followed by Sydenham Pit.
- Way Street Laydown Areas: Materials removal had commenced to handback area to Sydney Trains.
- XPT Laydown: Load-out of asbestos contaminated spoil stockpiles commenced. Slurry bins removed.
- Carrington Road Laydown: No access due to Interflow pump out of sewer pump house. Spoil load-out to Gateway project continued.
- **Bedwin Road**: Trackside fencing and handrail installation ongoing. Additional fencing, including solution for Edgeware Road apartments still under discussion.

Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

- Confluence Area: Backfilling of RW4 ongoing

ER Inspections

There were three ER inspections conducted by the ER in December 2021 (07/12/21; 14/12/21; 21/12/21). The key issues raised were:

Canterbury to Campsie BPS - Pat O'Connor Reserve (Canterbury):

ER Inspection #94 21/12/2021

- Tree protection and stabilised access to Minor Ancillary Facility (MAF) remains in place.
- No graffiti observed on shade cloth installed around MAF and cable bridge worksite (POC Reserve side).
- It was noted that stockpiles were either covered or in process of being covered (Ausgrid and POC Reserve side).
- Cable bridge worksite (Ausgrid side) sediment fence remains in place along bridge worksite with batters largely covered to manage potential run-off.
- Cable bridge worksite (Ausgrid side) SC informed the ER that top-soil had been placed recently in this area with

seeding works planned. Discussed additional controls with SC to address exposed top-soil section prior to the Christmas shutdown period in case of wet weather events. SC to further discuss works/controls planned and implement additional control on top-soil section. Action raised and closed within the Inspection Report.

- Cable Bridge worksite (Reserve side) ESC controls remain in place at cable bridge worksite (Reserve side).
- Cable bridge worksite (Reserve side) No shade cloth in place on access gate section. SC informed the ER that installed shade cloth had blown over onto the pedestrian footpath recently, causing safety issues and was therefore removed. Action raised.

Southern Dive & SMTF South Marrickville:

ER Inspection #94 - 21/12/2021

- Good initiative observed for recycling of PPE.
- Low levels of water noted within temporary sump.
- No visible dust observed during the site inspection.
- ESC in place around stormwater pits in the eastern bypass and around track drainage areas.
- Construction WTP Discharge Point (DP2) Noted ESC in place around DP2 and treated/tested water as per EPL
 criteria is discharged directly into the stormwater drain. Some maintenance required to re-position stake, remove
 accumulated sediment/silt build up around DP2 and kerb drain at access/egress gate (Sydney steel road). Action
 raised.
- Site access gate and section of Sydney Steel Road near the site was generally clean and street sweeper was observed during the inspection.
- Sediment controls were noted along the kerb drains and gutter along Sydney Steel Road. Evidence of cleaning undertaken by SC street sweeper was observed in sections of the gutter apart from areas where cars were parked. It was agreed with SC that further maintenance would be undertaken prior to the Christmas Shutdown Period to remove sediment build up and leaf litter within the kerb gutter along Sydney Steel Road. Action raised.

ER Inspection #92 - 07/12/2021

Northern Hub

- Site access/ egress points and road observed to be clean at the time of inspection.
- No graffiti observed on hoarding around site boundary.
- Housekeeping/dust management external yard areas generally tidy and street sweeper observed during the inspection.
- Hopetoun Ave concrete delivery in progress; with appropriate control in place (plastic tarp) to capture potential
 concrete spills/leaks. SC informed the ER that the Project Team had changed the concreting works schedule to
 accommodate Hopetoun Ave resident's exam schedule on Wednesday, 8th December; with no concreting works
 scheduled to occur on this date.

Valetta Lane Access

- No works at Valetta Lane worksite.
- No graffiti observed on shade cloth around access gate and the boundary fence.

Artarmon TSS Site

- TSS site entrance and section of Whiting St near site was observed to be tidy during the inspection.
- Minor tagging observed on shade cloth on boundary fence, shade cloth noted to be frayed and missing in a couple sections of the boundary fence. Action raised within the Inspection Report.

Blues Point Access Site

- Site access/ egress point observed to be clean at the time of inspection and rumble grid remains in place with suitable capacity.
- Acoustic shed demolition completed. It was noted and discussed that no noise related complaints were received relating to these works.
- Backfilling of shaft underway with appropriate controls in place around concrete deliveries. SC informed the ER that backfilling works are scheduled to be completed to ground level by 24th December.
- SC informed the ER that surface water is managed and pumped from a sump into a 15,000L tank. A vacuum truck is then utilised to transfer water to the Project's Water Treatment Plant at the CDS.
- Good housekeeping observed within the Material Laydown area.
- Shade cloth installed along pedestrian access remains in place and was observed to be free of graffiti.
- Beach Access (opened to the Public) Hoarding observed to be free of graffiti. ESC remains in place along

sections of the beach access.

ER Inspection #93 - 14/12/2021

SW Corridor Traction Substation sites

Canterbury TSS

- Noise blankets remain installed on Hutton St side. No high-noise works being undertaken at the time of the inspection.
- Tree Protection (with noise blankets installed) and sediment fence alongside the ATF, remain in place.
- SC informed the ER that temporary drainage is in place until conduits are installed; permanent drainage works to follow. ESC controls observed around drain in area.
- Discussion held with SC regarding dewatering on-site. ER requested SC for most recent dewatering permit, which was provided by SC following inspection.
- Section of shade cloth on the boundary fence to be re-attached and few sections to be re-installed (with branding facing Hutton St). Note raised and SC close out provided within Inspection Report.
- No graffiti observed on shade cloth installed along Hutton St side.
- Construction material laydown area (Hutton St) Some litter, packaging waste and sand observed within the Material laydown area on Hutton St. Action raised.

Dulwich Hill TSS

- Site access/egress (Randall St) observed to be clean at time of inspection.
- Site access/egress (Randall St) Rumble grid no longer in place and access point is stabilised with DGB placed over geofabric layer. SC informed the ER that additional geofabric is placed prior to/during material loadout, which has now reduced considerably.
- SC informed the ER that material stockpiled in area would be utilised in backfilling the excavation and any surplus material would be taken off- site for disposal.

Campsie TSS

- PPE recycling (good initiative) box observed on-site.
- Excavation for final section of conduits and crane access completed along Northern wall of TSS.
- TPZ remains in place.
- Good housekeeping observed in material laydown area and generally around site.
- Site access/egress (Lillian St) observed to be generally clean at the time of inspection.

Lakemba TSS

- Stabilised concrete access/egress with rumble grid remains in place.
- The Boulevarde was observed to be clean with no tracking observed at time of inspection.
- Laydown area access/egress stabilised with ballast.
- Secondary containment noted around Concure and Jerry Can storage.

Punchbowl TSS

- Stabilised access/egress (with ballast) and rumble grid in place. Discussed tracking observed on South Terrace (section near site access/egress) with SC and additional control of geofabric required during spoil load out. SC confirmed that road sweeper would be deployed to address tracking/install geofabric. Action raised and SC close out included within Inspection Report.
- Sediment controls observed along fencing on South Terrace side of works.
- TPZ in place for retained tree.
- No go zone/signage in place for threatened species (Acacia Pubescens).
- Tree removal completed for current scope of works.
- No graffiti observed on shade cloth installed on boundary fence.
- Conduit storage area SC mentioned trench alignment proposed in vicinity of trees in this area is under further design investigation to avoid/minimise impacts on trees where practicable and that an arborist would be consulted for further assessment based on design.

Non-compliances:

No non-compliances recorded for the reporting period.

LW North - Complaints:

- 2/12/21 Waterloo (LWW) Worker Behaviour Business owner emailed Waterloo ISD Project Director to express concerns about SC's subcontractor (Quickway) parking in front of their business.
- 4/12/21 Blues Point (LWW) Waste Management Resident concerned about debris left after site was demobilised.
- 5/12/21 Waterloo (LWW) Noise & Vibration (OOHW) Resident complained about the vibration she is experiencing from the train line. Resident stated in her email that she is under medication and the vibrations interrupt her sleep.
- 9/12/21 Blues Point Worker behaviour Resident called to complain about a Boral truck idling in a no stopping zone. He claimed that the driver had left the truck to go to a nearby cafe for a coffee.
- 9/12/21 Blues Point Waste Management Resident complained about debris and material left after clean-up and sent photos to NS Council. Council approached SM and the matter was subsequently referred to SC.
- 10/12/21 Waterloo (LWW) Noise & Vibration (OOHW) Further to earlier complaint (on 5/12/21), resident complained about the continued vibration she is experiencing.



Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to complaints have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Complaints are discussed where relevant for each package below.

There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

MP-ISD

Nil incidents or non-compliances were reported or observed during the reporting period. There were no complaints reported to have been received by Lendlease.

VC-ISD

Nil incidents or non-compliances were reported or observed during the reporting period.

Three complaints were reported by the project during the reporting period:

- 1/12/2021 Consultation OOHW; Working hours North Site. Resident stated that he has noticed the tower crane on the North site has been working outside the standard construction hours each night (past 8pm tonight). Resident queried if the local area has been notified of this work and that resident didn't recall seeing the notification.
- 9/12/2021 Worker behaviour Complaint received from building manager on Berry St requesting that workers do not congregate or wait in front of their building on Berry St; it is inconveniencing their tenants.
- 10/12/2021 Noise and vibration OOHW South Site: Complaint received by email from resident complaining of noise at 6am; requested if this is within hours of operation.

CN-ISD

There was one noncompliance relating to washing of a concrete hopper without adequate containment. One minor incident (concrete hopper wash water not contained, entering the stormwater system before being contained) reported to the ER, which was managed adequately.

Four (4) complaints were reported by the project during the reporting period. Three (3) related to worker behaviour resulting in OOH noise disturbance. One related to mains power supply resumption ahead of schedule following generator supply during interruption for cut-over.

ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted by the ER in December 2021 (09/12/2021 and 23/12/2021). The key issues raised at these inspections were:

- A covered area was in use for refuelling of plant. One jerry can of ULP was stored within the area, though did not have secondary containment. A spill kit was not present. Risk of spill migration to nearby drain (to the WTP).
- The project induction does not currently include an environmental component.
- An IBC of sodium hydroxide (NaOH), and several IBCs of potassium permanganate, were stored adjacent to the WTP without adequate secondary containment.
- Stockpiles of filter cake were not covered and material was piled on top of controls. Low risk due to runoff to the WTP.
- Issues have been raised with the volume of water infiltrating into deep excavations associated with the stormwater trunk relocation works. The WTP does not have adequate capacity so alternative methods are currently under consideration to remove the water to allow the base slab to be poured.
- Trenching is proposed through an INSW landscaped area, requiring the removal of several established trees on the waterfront. Alternatives to design are being discussed.



ER Inspections

- A significant volume of sediment and drainage rock had accumulated in ERSED controls in the gutter alongside the JHLOR piling pad on Victoria Road. Material appeared to have originated from the JHLOR worksite.
- Significant tracking was observed from the site access along Ewart Street. The street sweeper was engaged at the time of the inspection, and the traffic controller was provided with the street sweeper's contact details.
- One cess drainage pit grate near the ULX work zone was not protected; low risk of sediment entry.
- Reo and spare materials were stored under the dripline of trees.
- Bus lanes had been handed back to Sydney Buses during the possession to accommodate train replacement services. Additional car spaces for the bus company had reportedly not been used, potentially wasting valuable car parking spaces for the public.

Actions were raised for the above issues, and all actions were in the process of being closed-out by JHLOR.
