Key Construction Activities During the Period

Works conducted during the reporting period included:

- Metro Box Ongoing construction activities for the Chillers and Ventilation Building. Fit out of platform Canopies ongoing. Installation of skylight panels in Platform 14. Fit out of the Platform and other levels. Various FRP works for platform edges. Ventilation fans operating in Mole Hole 3 with silencers. Installation of escalators and fit out within the various levels.
- Central Walk Ongoing installation of new escalators and final panels around the new escalators. Other fit out activities. Works within hoarded work zones on suburban Platforms 16-23 and platform surface excavation during rail possession weekends. Works within hoarded work zones on suburban Platforms 16-23 and platform surface excavation during rail possession weekends. Excavation of spoil from some escalator access points on northern side of Central Walk.
- Sydney Yard A small capacity WTP operating to treat surface waters with other water largely directed to Marrickville

 subject to capacity restraints there. Water pumped from the Track slabs via various tanks to the WTP. Truck access;
 laydown; stockpiling of spoil.
- Northern Concourse Ongoing works at intersection of Northern Concourse and Metro Box area. Facier panels under the TCAC building being placed.
- Eastern Entrance FRP for roof slab completed. Randle Lane remains closed. Ongoing fit out and general
 construction activities.
- Devonshire Street Tunnel In operation and used by commuters.
- CSR works Rail Institute Barriers remain in place for compound area where there is material access to the Ghost Platform and CSR conduits. Bitumen resurfacing of impacted areas form the CSR works.
- ESR Concourse Ongoing use of the area for laydown and construction support. Fit out and other construction activities ongoing.
- Ghost Platforms (above ESR Platforms 24-25) Ongoing electrical and other fit out.

ER Inspections


There were two ER inspections conducted during the reporting period on 11th and 25th May. Personnel from DPE attended the site visit on 25th May 2022. Issues raised during these inspections included:

- Management of water at the OSD and the potential for offsite water discharge during heavy rain events;
- Noise controls on site equipment;
- Spill kit management; and
- Screening of work area.

Water management continued to be a challenge during the period with continued wet weather; the WTP being decommissioned; and Line Wide not able to accept water during all hours of every day. LOR reported that water was pumped to the surface and on to the WTP. It was noted during the inspection on 11 May that there was some pooling of water on the surface where some water has potentially overtopped controls to the environment (ballast). The inspection on 25th May showed the pump to the WTP operating effectively. Discharge of water to the environment during significant rain events is covered under the Water Overflow Strategy. A draft updated Strategy was reviewed and commented on during the reporting period.

As project continues, there are reduced civil works and reduced environmental (e.g. ERSED) risks as compared to previous stages of the project.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily as well as to the ER.

One complaint was received at 5:45am on 27 May 2022 in relation to noise from the Sydney Yard. LOR investigated the complaint and issued a Non-Compliance report for the event, noting a non-compliance with EPL Condition L4.1 which restricts construction works only be undertaken between the hours of 7:00 and 18:00 (Mon-Fri) and 8:00-13:00 Sat. The

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event is also considered to represent a Non-Compliance with Condition E36 of the Project Approval which reflects similar construction hours.

One complaint was received on 2 May, however not considered to relate to LOR works.

No Incidents were reported that would trigger reporting under Condition A41.

Summary of Environmental Performance

The scope of works conducted during the reporting period was small and low risk. The project is winding down with most project scope complete, with mainly defects remaining. The project site is being maintained well and the new Sydenham Station structure, plazas, heritage interpretation features, and landscaping are looking very stylish. The Environmental Representative (ER) is waiting on the completion of all scope and spoil load-out from laydown areas before handover and condition completion is finalised.

ER Inspections

There were no ER inspections conducted by the ER in May 2022 due to minimal activity. There are some actions from previous inspections that remain open until the handover process has been finalised:

The removal of graffiti on Bedwin Road bridge, Sydenham Pit Pump House and on the confluence structure.

ER Inspections

There were four ER inspections conducted by the ER in May 2022 (10/05/22; 17/05/22; 24/05/22; 30/05/22). Key issues and actions raised are summarised below:

Southern Dive, SMTF South, BPS works and Barangaroo Shaft:

ER Inspection #110 - SMTF S, BPS works and Barangaroo Shaft - 17/05/22 (Tuesday)

Southern Dive & SMTF South Marrickville:

- Due to heavy rain and internal site run off, there was a significant volume of mud slurry along the internal roadway. The management of this was discussed at some length by the ER, the site supervisor, SC EM and SC EC. Once dry, tracked mud is reported to be cleaned up using the site street sweeper. Whilst not observed in action, SC committed to actioning the clean-up of the tracked mud on the hardstand to minimise the potential for dust as the site dried out.
- Near the former site sheds, a row of fill material had been placed in a sizeable berm. The berm was not covered and wind-blown dust was observed coming off the uncovered berm and the adjacent hardstand. Agreed actions are to cover the berm and removed tracked mud on the hardstand to minimise the potential for dust as the site dried out
- Empty drum of hardener to be removed and correctly stored or disposed of. Action raised and closed out by SC.
- A poorly established concrete slurry washout noted in the far western portion of the site. No immediate environmental risk was observed however it was clear that improvements to the set-up of the wash out area could be made to reflect best practice requirements. SC were asked to review the set-up, confirm what practices had been committed to in the environmental plans and then implement improvements.

Barangaroo Shaft

- Minor spill of diesel observed in the tunnel at Barangaroo. Some evidence that some absorbent pads had been applied however further clean-up was required (including removal of the dirty pads). The fuelling station should be bunded. Systems Connect were to raise an incident report.
- A number of cigarette butts were observed by the SC Environment Manager at the entry to the site. It is recommended that it is confirmed that adequate facilities for cigarette disposal are present and that site workers are tool boxed on using them.

<u>ER Inspection #111 - Northern Hub and Artarmon – TSS 24/05/22</u> (Tuesday; rain 0.0 mm rain since 9am however rain 30.8mm in the previous 24 hours)

Northern Hub

• Storage Yard between Spoil shed, logistics shed and the water treatment area – Excessive amount of silt/slurry observed at the exit of the Logistics Shed near the pick-up sump of the water treatment plant. SC investigated this and it was agreed at the time of inspection that this would be cleaned up from the hardstand areas.

SW Corridor Traction Substation sites

ER Inspection #109 and #112 – 10/05/2022 and 30/05/22) (Tuesdays)

Campsie TSS

• ESC maintenance actions raised for damaged coir log noted near site access to be replaced and geofabric to be pulled back/reinstated on batter.

Belmore St Compound

- Material stored near small tree (on rail corridor side of fence), to be removed.
- Discussed and agreed with SC regarding some general housekeeping required (emu pick of litter) within compound. Punchbowl TSS
 - Topsoil laid recently for landscaping of small section along road verge. SC to install jute mesh.

Dulwich Hill TSS (no works -site closed; inspected site access/egress only)

- Discussed installation of sediment controls in area near site access (appeared to have been recently reshaped/graded for works within site), removal of some sediment in gutter and some mud spots on road surface near site access.
- SC informed the ER that DGB had been laid and area re-graded further to minimise erosion, in addition to sediment controls placed alongside the fence following last ER Inspection. Minor sediment and damaged bag noted in gutter, to be removed.



Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256.

The following minor incidents (Class 3 events) reported to the ER, for this reporting period.

- 17/05/22 Barangaroo Shaft Class 3 Whilst refuelling a fuel/jerry can at the track level at Barangaroo shaft, approximately 0.3 L of fuel (Diesel) spill occurred on the hardstand surface of the tunnel. Spill kit materials were deployed to successfully clean up the fuel spill. The spill was limited to the hardstand surface of the tunnel and the spill did not enter any drains).
- 27/05/2022 Campsie TSS Class 3 A minor hydraulic oil leak (<5 L) occurred from a failed fitting and section of tubing on the crane. Crane stopped and Spill kit deployed. Spill contained on the road surface directly beneath the crane and cleaned up. No resultant pollution.

One non-compliance was reported to the ER in this reporting period, following a complaint on 28/05/22.

28/5/22 – Valetta Lane - Saturday 28/5/22 at 6:30am, a subcontractor (DMT) accessed the Valetta Lane site without SC's knowledge and picked up an excavator (outside of approved hours) at his own discretion not knowing any restrictions applied. The driver did not have site pre-approval and did not check if restrictions applied to the site. A community complaint resulted and stakeholder complained regarding noisy trucks idling outside his home in the morning (refer 28/05/22 complaint below). The sub-contractor has raised preventive actions that all deliveries to be booked in and approved. SC has drafted a toolbox and requested this be delivered to all DMT personnel involved with Line-wide works. SC has also issued a reminder to DMT that all personnel accessing project areas must complete project inductions.

LW Northern Sites - Complaints:

- 03/05/22 Waterloo LWW 1 X complaint about worker behaviour vehicle was parked on a private residential parking by SC worker.
- 28/05/22 Northern Connection (Chatswood) 1 x complaint Noise & Vibration OOHW/Standard hours resident complained about noisy trucks idling outside his home in the morning during the week and then also on Saturday morning at 6.30am (outside approved construction hours).

LW Southern Sites - Complaints:

- 05/05/22 Lakemba TSS 1 complaint about Utility Supply interruptions Resident's enquiry become a complaint due to air conditioners making a fluttering noise after they said they were taken off mains and onto generator power.
- 07/05/22 Punchbowl TSS 1 complaint Traffic, Transport & Parking Complainant concerned no traffic controllers were in place at closed roads to allow local traffic in and out.
- 07/05/22 Campsie to Canterbury power upgrade 1 x complaint Traffic, Transport & Parking -Local driver failed to follow traffic controller's directions at the joint bay site ran into a detour sign, exited vehicle, checked for damage on their car and abused traffic control workers. Local driver was encouraged to make a formal complaint (yet to be received)
- 08/05/22 Campsie TSS 1 complaint Flora & Fauna; Traffic, Transport & Parking; Worker behaviour Resident
 complained about idling truck for longer than it should, worker behaviour and allegedly being sworn at, truck clipping
 trees and amount provided by offers of respite.
- 12/5/2022 Canterbury (BPS works) 1 complaint Property Access; Traffic, Transport & Parking Project team was contacted by the resident regarding a parking fine they received. In addition, the resident sent photos (date stamped 16 Feb 2022) of loose nails allegedly from the worksite that appear to have punctured their car tyre and raised complaints about their driveway continuously being blocked by joint bay work.
- 24/05/22 Dulwich Hill TSS 1 complaint Structure design Stakeholder raised concerns about the height of the precast walls from the substation behind their property.

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 25/05/22 – Canterbury (BPS works) - 1 complaint - related to Traffic, Transport & Parking - Stakeholder wanted to know when the joint bay would be closed so the parking situation on their street could return to normal.

Complaints unrelated to SM/SC activities:

- 25/05/22 Marrickville Dive
- Dewar Street without prior Site & SMTFS -1 complaint regarding waste management
- 07/05/22 Campsie TSS 1 complaint Traffic, Transport & Parking Operations Manager at Campsie RSL complained about road closure at notification.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Complaints in the Southwest Corridor in reporting period were noted around WE45 possession works.
- Current works at LWW sites continue to be managed appropriately; with some sites transitioning to low environmental risk (for e.g. Artarmon TSS, Campsie TSS, Blues Point)
- Overall, the Project performed well in reporting period. ER Inspections across this month identified some actions/minor improvements.
- The Project Team continue to be responsive to queries/comments raised in document reviews and recommendations made by the ER.

Looking forward:

- Surry Hills BPS works in June during Standard Construction Hours and OOHWs (between 5 -14th Jun 22); cable pulling works at 3 locations Randle Ln, Elizabeth St and Belmore St.
- Ongoing Campsie BPS Joint Bay cable removal cable pulling and dewatering works (Standard Construction Hours) anticipated completion mid-June 2022.
- OOHW Campsie BPS Joint Bay dewatering works (contingency OOHW for dewatering, dependant on wet weather) OOHWA extended from mid Apr- mid May to mid-June). As per the ER's OOHWA condition, SC is required to provide a weekly progress report of any OOHW for dewatering. To date SC has reported no OOHW undertaken for dewatering. Continue to monitor actual OOHWs undertaken in June through weekly progress report updates from SC to the ER.
- Midyear shutdown possession (2 July 2022 to 14 July 2022) planning, coordination meetings for discussion of scope, associated OOHWAs/noise modelling including cumulative impacts anticipated.

ER Inspections

MP-ISD

There were no ER inspections conducted by the ER in May. Inspections are now conducted monthly, with an inspection conducted on 29th April 2022 and the following on 3rd June 2022. A planned inspection on 27 May was postponed one week due to illness of one inspection participant from Sydney Metro. The inspection on 3rd June identified one issue related to lack of secondary containment for small chemical containers.

Lend Lease reported that water treatment plant operations had continued to keep up with the elevated rainfall received during the month.

VC-ISD

Two ER inspection conducted by the ER on 03 May 2022 and 24 May 2022 (Tuesdays) (ER inspections are on a three weekly cycle weather permitting). The following issues were raised as actions for the Contractor to address:

- Noted sand from previously damaged sediment bags remains in area.
- Discussed minor tidy up required on Miller St either through handheld sweeping or by mobilising a sweeper.
- Minor tagging observed on site hoarding.

CN-ISD

There were two ER inspections on 11 May 2022 and 25 May 2022 respectively (ER inspections are on a fortnightly cycle weather permitting). Both inspections were conducted by the ER. The following issues were raised:

- AWE to implement measures/procedures that ensure concrete washout containers are emptied more regularly, and are covered when wet weather is forecast.
- General decline in attention to housekeeping throughout the site since the previous inspection to be addressed.
- AWE to review EWP procurement and ensure only broadband alarms are used.
- Polystyrene foam waste to be cleaned up. Implement measures to control foam degradation and waste generated after use

PS-ISD

There were two ER inspections conducted by the ER on 3 May and 24 May 2022 (ER inspections are on a 3 weekly cycle weather permitting). There were no issues raised during the inspections.

WL-ISD

There was one ER inspection conducted by the ER on 12/05/2022 (ER inspections are on a 3 weekly cycle weather permitting). ER Inspection undertaken concurrent to DPE Site Inspection walk.

The key points raised at this inspection were:

- No issues raised by DPE Representatives
- Observe scaffold and acoustic scaffold sheeting installation. JHG advise up to 10dB reduction in noise may be possible
- Observe fit-out of Platform Level and discuss interfaces with Linewide and TSOM. Note with DPE that noise from fitout of station is not significant once above ground level slab
- Discuss hardstand access, entry & exit gates for deliveries and to prevent reversing movements out of site gates
- Discuss water management and Water Treatment Plant (WTP) for all site water and rainwater
- JHG discussing upcoming Capping Beam demolition work with Acoustic Advisor (AA)

Complaints / Incidents / Non-compliance

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to complaints have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Complaints are discussed where relevant for each package below.

There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

MP-ISD

One Non-Compliance was reported by Lendlease on 6th May 2022 regarding NATA calibration of the continuous noise monitoring equipment within 50 Martin Place. Lendlease reported that the NATA calibration hadn't been carried out within the required two-year period. Appendix E of the Construction Noise and Vibration Management Plan defined calibration requirements. The CNVMP is required under Condition C3(a).

There were no complaints reported to have been received by Lendlease during the reporting period.

VC-ISD

Nil incidents or non-compliances reported to the ER during this reporting period. There were two Project related complaints (summarised below) during the reporting period relating to:

- 4/5/2022 Noise & Vibration OOHW- Complaint received from Vibe Hotel Maintenance Manager regarding noise overnight impacting guest stay. Wanted more details about the work to manage guests and to minimise the impacts.
- 26/5/22 Noise & Vibration OOHW Complaint received regarding noise from the south site on Tuesday 24.5.22.
 Resident asking why works were being conducted on site at 10:45pm, if that time was approved working hours.

CN-ISD

There were no non-compliances/incidents reported to the ER. There were five complaints during the period relating to:

- 4 May Stakeholder called to express dissatisfaction with Noise coming from outside throughout the night including beeping and machinery sounds. On inspection, there appeared to be road re-sheeting work occurring on Oxley and Nicolson Streets by Lane Cove Council. Stakeholder agreed it was likely Lane Cove Council, and will follow up with Council.
- 9 May Stakeholder contacted Sydney Metro regarding lost power to building over last three evenings since Saturday 7 May. Upon investigation, the stakeholder was informed that it was not Sydney Metro related. Stakeholder was satisfied with response.
- 11 May Stakeholder informed that they could hear workers during girder deliveries. Upon investigation Project contacted stakeholder, discussed activities and agreed on use of additional staff and walkie talkies to limit any need for shouting during girder deliveries.
- 27 May Stakeholder advised she is dissatisfied with response received relating to a conversation had with the Crows Nest Station Place manager as part of a consultation doorknock. Issues relate to ongoing noise and dust issues that stakeholder believes is caused from work site. Also, an enquiry was raised in relation to a respite offer made by former contractors (John Holland) to treat/sound proof windows. Place Manager Offered onsite noise monitoring at stakeholder's premises and on SM advice emailed stakeholder suggesting they contact Sydney Metro directly relating to the details of the respite offer presented to some stakeholder in the past by previous contractors. Complaint remains open until noise monitoring at the stakeholder's premises

PS-ISD

There were no non-compliances and 3 incidents were reported to the ER:

- 7 May Concrete vibrator use resulted in noise levels above those predicted in the CNVIS due to the vibrator contacting structural surfaces, which coupled to adjoining structures propagating ground borne noise. Although alarms were generated those alarms were not attended to, and the vibrator was not moved away from the surface in question, resulting in a Noise complaint.
- 14 May During a concrete pour at Ground Level of Pitt Street South there was a spillage of concrete slurry from the site under the hoarding and on to the footpath of Pitt Street at the Pitt Street South site. CPB Supervision team reacted immediately to the slurry spill and were able to contain the volume (approximately 5 litres) before it entered the roadway and stormwater drain. Due to the minor nature of the spill no further controls were required to contain the spill.
- 26 May CPB was informed by Castlereagh Boutique Hotel that concrete slurry had been spilled from the Pitt Street North site onto the southern light well of the hotel. No run-off occurred with the concrete hardening in place within two drains. There was no impact to the heritage value of the building. Heritage consultant Graham Brooks confirmed that there was no apparent damage to any quality finishes, materials or equipment within the light well that make any contribution to the heritage significance of the building. The root cause of this incident is still under investigation

There were 8 complaints during the period relating to noise.

- 7 May Complaint regarding noise at 6am on Saturday morning, and advised the noise was from a machine, however couldn't see it. CPB comms investigated noise complaint and confirmed the noise was from a concrete vibrator during a concrete pour approver under an OOHW approval. However, an incident report, described above, was initiated to investigate the occurrence and consider preventative measures for future occurrences.
- 9 May Complaint regarding ongoing OOHW noise from Metro construction sites, one on corner of Pitt and Park streets, and the other on Castlereagh Street.
- 14 May Complaint regarding loud music played by workers at Pitt Street South site. Stakeholder called about alarm noise from the Pitt Street North site. CPB informed stakeholder that site crew to be tool boxed on issue and no loud radios/speakers on site.
- 19 May Enquiry about work starting earlier than 7am, due to loud noise.
- 20 May Complaint regarding banging and hammering until 11 pm at Pitt Street South during approved OOHW.
- 24 May Complaint regarding noise. Stakeholder wanted to confirm working hours as she thought they were 7am to 6pm. CPB comms spoke with resident, provided reasoning as to why work is taking place during the night. Also provided details on night works that night.
- 25 May Complaint regarding noise. CPB comms spoke with resident to understand type of noise heard during the night. Resident will also send through video of the noise.
- 27 May Complaint regarding noise from Pitt Street South around 5am. Resident sent through a video of the noise via email. Currently investigating source of noise

WL-ISD

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER this reporting period. There were 2 minor oil spill incidents related to site.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks due to rainfall events decreased during May and accumulated mud and debris has been able to be scraped up from across the hardstand.

On 31st May the ER was notified when a plume of red/brown water was identified in the harbour. A draft incident report has been raised and DPE and EPA have been notified in accordance with CoA A41 and A44. The incident is under investigation pending water quality monitoring results, but the correct process was followed and remedial actions have been raised to reduce the risk of a recurrence. Based on the advice received at this stage of the investigation it is unlikely that the discharge would have caused environmental harm. The incident classification is pending.

The monthly and quarterly water monitoring program continues to be implemented (though not required by the planning approval or Staging Report). Exceedances have been explained in contractor reporting as required and the reporting system amended as an improvement opportunity.

The transfer of water from the adjacent Linewide site to the BESIX Watpac site has been reviewed and a discharge permit process implemented to better allocate and assess risks associated with the process. The process will also be followed for groundwater pumped from Linewide's PC on Level B6 of the station box to the BESIX Watpac WTP.

Compliance with waste classification and management practices, including following the Unexpected Finds Protocol is currently being reviewed. The hazardous waste tracking process has been a key focus for the management of coal tar and asbestos contaminated spoil. Remediation strategies are also under discussion with the contractor's contamination consultants.

ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted by the ER in May 2022 (11th and 26th May). The key issues raised during the inspections were:

- Stockpiling of spoil contaminated with coal tar (hazardous waste). Runoff and leachate from coal tar has been known
 to cause adverse ecological impacts on downstream aquatic ecosystems (TfNSW Technical Direction 21). Compliance
 with Section 3.5 of the Spoil Management Plan was discussed.
- The waste tracking process for hazardous waste will need to be carefully monitored, and the remediation approach for the site confirmed and agreed.

- Stockpiles of spoil classified as GSW (including filter cake from the WTP appeared to be placed within a low point. This is not best environmental practice and increases the risk of dirty water runoff across the site and into the WTP.
- Future water discharge issues need to be resolved soon to allow the completion of the stormwater trunk relocation scope, particularly completion of the western-most pit. Water quality monitoring is ongoing to form a baseline and the Water Discharge Impact Assessment (WDIA), and CEMP are pending an update for submission to DPE for approval.
- Landowner (INSW) consent for proposed seawater cooling system scope is required prior to commencement (involving tree removal at Nawi Cove).
- A consistency assessment for the use of additional land on the western side of the site / extension of site boundary for pipe investigation works is in progress after a NC was raised.





Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period:

There was one incident for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period:

- **31/5/2022:** At approximately 11am a plume of brown coloured water was observed in Nawi Cove. The following corrective actions were taken immediately to address the cause of environmental harm:
 - o An investigation into the source of the visible plume in Nawi Cove began immediately
 - Construction activities in the vicinity of the harbour were ceased
 - o The WTP discharge into the harbour was ceased immediately upon becoming aware of the issue
 - o Stormwater pits, which drain to the harbour, were opened to locate the source of the issue
 - Water samples from Nawi Cove were taken for laboratory analysis to establish whether the discharge had caused an adverse impact on water quality, marine life, or human safety.

The following partied were notified:

- o 12:31pm Environmental Representative (ER)
- o 12:38pm Sydney Metro Environmental Coordinator
- 12:53pm NSW Environmental Protection Authority (EPA)
- 8:31pm Department of Planning and Environment (DPE)

There was one Class 3 incident for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER for the period:

20/5/2022: Surface water runoff from Hickson Road ponded in a low point in the gutter next to the slip lane that serves the northern shaft. Following a rain event, oil was observed running off the road from an area that had been recently cold tarred. Spill kits were deployed. The water was pumped to a holding tank where it will be tested and disposed as liquid waste. The oil did not enter the stormwater system. The cold mix from which the oil was observed to be leaching was removed and replaced with hot mix asphalt.

The ER is aware of two complaints received during May 2022 related to the BESIX Watpac works:

- 29/4/2022 (Reported on 2/5/2022): Complaint regarding redirected buses making noise on Kent Street up to 3am during OOHW. Provided the dates for upcoming OOHW.
- 14/5/2022: Complaint about tragic backing up along Kent Street on Saturday night due to a detour in place to allow for emergency works to occur on Hickson Road. Fumes were entering the resident's home. Traffic control measures for future works are being investigated in response. The emergency works were conducted under Condition of Approval (CoA) E44(b) and notification was undertaken in accordance with CoA E45, including to the community.

Respite has been offered in the form of 2x 2Hrs daytime respite, and no noisy works after midnight during OOH. OOH Works are also scheduled so works are not conducted in the same location for more than two consecutive nights. Alternative Accommodation has not been triggered, though is available to be offered if required on a case-by-case basis.

An increase in complaints is anticipated once the demolition of Hickson Road commences, which has been delayed until June.

Audits

An Independent Environmental Audit was conducted by WolfPeak on 11 May 2022. One observation was raised (in relation to water quality monitoring), which had been flagged prior to the audit and was in the process of being rectified by the site team.

Summary of Environmental Performance

The avoidance of impact to mapped TECs as defined in Revised Environmental Mitigation Measure (REMM) B4 remains an ongoing focus. Works have been conducted in accordance with requirements to date. All TEC areas inspected during ER inspections have been appropriately barricaded and sign-posted and workers tool-boxed at pre-start as required.

Erosion and Sediment Control Plans (ESCPs) are consistently reviewed and updated for new work areas and changed activities. The ESCPs demonstrate that Erosion and Sediment (ERSED) issues have been reviewed in detail before applying required controls.

Any actions raised during ER inspections have been minor in nature and closed-out promptly with evidence provided.

ER Inspections

There were three ER inspections conducted in May 2022 (3rd, 17th & 31st May). Actions raised during the inspections were related to the following issues:


- The stabilisation of areas being handed over to the Linewide contractor

Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC, BEW and BAC.

There was one non-compliance reported to the ER for during the period:

• **SMC-NCR-002 (16/5/2022):** A PCMWA was prepared for survey and geotechnical investigation for BAC. The approval had expired when Out of Hours (OOH) survey works were undertaken on 16/5/2022. The PCMWA was updated and approved so investigation works could continue.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400.

There was one Class 3 environmental incident reported to the ER during the period:

• SMC-INC-021 (16/5/2022): Concrete staining was observed adjacent to the work area at Duke Street, Campsie footbridge and along the gutter down North Parade during an ER inspection on 17/5/2022. There was no migration into the stormwater system.

The ER is not aware of any complaints received during May 2022 related to the SMC_BEW_BAC works.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Weekend 45 (WE45) Possession (Marrickville, Canterbury & Lakemba):

Out of Hours (OOH) Works were assessed and approved and mitigation applied.

Marrickville:

 - Cumulative impacts are being discussed during planned meetings with contractors, Sydney Metro and Environmental Representatives (ERs) on 3rd & 24th June 2022

- Continuation of MSB construction and/or fit-out at all stations
- Demolition and reconstruction of Canterbury stairs, and lift installation

ER Inspections

There were three ER inspections conducted for the period (4th, 7th and 25th May). The key issues raised during the inspections were:

Marrickville:

- The WTP had been removed. Water had accumulated in the ULX pit and would need to be dewatered. A plan for dewatering was not in place.
- A large stockpile had been generated during the WE45 possession and was placed in the MSB site. There were no controls around the base of the stockpile.
- The Erosion and Sediment Control Plan (ESCP) showed the WTP in place and discharge to the SMC cess on the opposite side of Victoria Road bridge, which had been ceased due to potential issues to the SMC piling pad.
- Drums of wastewater from groundwater monitoring conducted about a year ago were stored on the boundary of the site. It is possible the drums contain hydrocarbons from the onsite plume.

Canterbury:

- The site access was in poor condition during spoil load-out. The cattle grid was full of mud and covered with black plastic. Mud was accumulating in the site access, resulting in tracking onto Charles Street.
- Sydney Metro shade cloth had come down in one location on the boundary fence.

Lakemba:

- The unauthorised use of accessible car parking spaces for the project was raised, which has been an ongoing issue. A non-compliance is being considered.
- A large volume of thick sediment sludge had accumulated at the bottom of the site. Controls were in place reducing the risk of entry to the stormwater pit, though the source of the sediment requires better management.

All stations:

A previous ER action (#34A) to update ESCPs for all sites remains open.

Non-Compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for MCL.

The ER is aware of three Non-Compliances (NCRs) for the period that could be attributed to MCL works:

- HSE-NCR-029-5/5/22: The lease and A17 project approval for use of the ancillary facility at 6 Broughton Street, Canterbury had expired, with use continuing. Actions were raised to obtain a lease renewal and extend the A17 approval.
- HSE-NCR-031-6/5/22: The ER has requested Road Occupancy Licences (ROLs) for all stations to be provided since
 23/3/2022. This was not forthcoming from the stations and as a result a non-compliance was raised against A27 in CTR Q1 2022. (NB: This NCR was raised unofficially in the April 2022 ER Monthly Report).
- HSE-NCR-032-11/5/22: A hanging tree branch (potential safety hazard) was pruned without obtaining an arborist report, landholders' consent, or notification to DPE. An arborist is to be engaged to assess the health and condition of the damaged tree and provide recommendation/s.

There were no incidents for MCL reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

There was one Class 3 environmental incident for MCL reported to the ER:

7/5/22: Canterbury - During 400T crane mobilisation for WE45, a damaged hydraulic line resulted in a hydraulic oil to leak to the ground. The crane was stood down and the spill was contained and cleaned up. The crane was repaired and returned to operation.

The ER is aware of four complaints for the period that could be attributed to MCL works (there were two additional complaints which were deemed not related to Sydney Metro activities):

- 2/5/22: Canterbury Complaint regarding level of respite offered specifically that it doesn't cover four residents, only two. Resident had originally triggered Alternative Accommodation (AA) but did not accept and asked for the matter to be escalated to Sydney Metro. The Sydney Metro contacted the resident to explain the nature of respite and justification behind the amount to eligible residents.
- 9/5/22: Canterbury Noise complaint regarding WE45 works seeking respite offer (RO). Respite was subsequently offered and accepted. The apartment will be included for future consideration of respite.
- 12/5/22: Marrickville Complaint regarding vehicle parking across driveway. The offending electrical contractor was warned and steps taken to minimise the risk of recurrence.

HBI

■ 27/5/22: Lakemba – Complaint re workers taking up car parking spaces with cones. HSEJV claimed this was only for 15 mins while traffic controllers were setting up for safety reasons. Response was made to the complainant and the team were reminded to ensure available parking is maximised for the community.

Audits

• No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits. It is noted that the contractor conducted an internal audit in May 2022, but the ER was not provided adequate notice to attend.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

A new Environment Manager has been engaged for the MCL project, directly by the contractor. This engagement is hoped to result in closer attention to environmental management and an overall better result for the project. Due to previous NCR's and ER actions for works within approved areas, the ER conducted several meetings with Sydney Metro and HSEJV and recommended that training on the CSSI and approvals be provided.

- Continued implementation checks for CEMP and sub plans, focusing on ESC and parking / traffic impacts
- Review and endorsement of Sub-plans
- Compliance Tracking Q1 2022 review and endorsement
- Shutdown 3 OOHWA review and endorsement
- Internal audit of contamination management
- Internal audit of work approvals compliance.

ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted for HBW and DCP on 7th May and 11th May. The key issues raised during the inspections were:

Hurlstone Park

- A section of noise matting required reinstatement; Downer agreed to reinstate noise mitigation.
- Sediment from the pedestrian access at the MSB had potential to be tracked form site onto the roadway; Downer agreed to stabilise the pedestrian access.
- Concrete/waste bags were stored adjacent to a stormwater pit, noting that a rain event had commenced and there
 was potential for materials to enter the adjacent stormwater pit; owner immediately arranged for the bags to be
 relocated.
- Contractors were smoking outside residential properties outside of the designated smoking area on Railway Street.
 Downer immediately spoke with the contractors. Site staff would also be reminded to be mindful to residents and to smoke in designated area.
- Erosion and sediment control (ESC) required maintenance on Floss Street to prevent sediment release from site.
 Downer agreed to update the ESC to minimise impacts.

Belmore

• A contractor van had parked on the council strip outside of the MSB. This area was recently excavated and was being rehabilitated. Downer immediately notified site staff to move the vehicle and to add flagging tape to prevent access.

Wiley Park

During a heavy rain event sediment laden water was exiting the site. Inspection of the area indicated that the controls were installed for the small area, however redirection of water from a skip placed on the v-drain and additional water from the upstream catchment overwhelmed the controls. Downer immediately redeployed controls along Urunga Parade.

Dulwich Hill

No issues raised.

Campsie:

• Noise mitigation was not installed for the site generator; Downer agreed to install noise mitigation.

Punchbowl:

- Site staff were parking in the accessible car parks near the MSB; Downer agreed to relocate the vehicles.
- Noise mitigation was not installed on lighting towers on Urunga Parade; Downer agreed to install noise mitigation.

Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for DCP and HBW.

The ER is not aware of any non-compliances for the period that could be attributed to DCP or HBW works.

There were no incidents for DCP or HBW reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

There were no Class 3 environmental incidents for DCP or HBW reported to the ER.

The ER is aware of 11 complaints for the period that could be attributed to DCP and HBW works (there was one additional complaint which was deemed not related to Sydney Metro activities):

- 3/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Complaint related to noise, dust and dirt from vehicle movement on Railway Street. The site team advised concrete was being poured at the MSB site. A hose was being used for dust suppression. The site team advised they have placed noise blankets on the residents fence line. The stakeholder has requested a regular outdoor cleaning and car cleaning service to impacted residents; Metro's response is pending.
- 6/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Concern regarding noise over the Mother's Day weekend possession. Downer Comms emailed apology for disturbance, explaining the nature of planned shutdown periods and mitigation measures implemented during these times weekend.
- 9/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Complaint regarding fence damage following the WE45 possession. A pre-condition survey was offered prior to commencement of project, but was not taken up by the resident. The issue was further investigated, and the Place Manager has made an offer to reinstate the fence panel upon completion of works in this area.
- 10/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Complaint regarding noisy works during standard hours at the MSB site. The site team confirmed noise blankets are in place. The Place Manager offered custom earplugs or noise cancelling headphones. Four Noise cancelling headphones were ordered and sent to the stakeholder for her four sons.
- 12/5/22: Wiley Park. Complaint from mobility impaired resident regarding worker vehicles parking on Shadforth Street. The Place Manager phoned stakeholder and advised site team investigated and has spoken to workers and reminded them not to park on Shadforth Street.
- **23/5/22:** Hurlstone Park. Stakeholder claiming the fence post installation works are encroaching on their property boundary fence line. Surveyor results showed works are contained within the rail corridor. The Place Manager advised the surveyor would install pegs and a vibration monitor this week, which have since been installed.
- 24/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Complaint regarding noise during OOHW for an approved concrete overrun at the MSB site until 18:35 (complaint received at 18:05). Information has been provided to residents explaining reasons for late finish and relevant approvals. Retrospective respite vouchers are being offered to the four most impacted properties as a gesture of goodwill.
- 24/5/22: Dulwich Hill. Complaint regarding cumulative impacts. Resident expressed frustration at the length of construction; delays are impacting their property and life. They would like to add a mural to their property but cannot until work is completed due to dust and rocks. Approved message sent to resident. Resident responded angrily saying they will take complaint further and ended with do not respond.
- **25/5/22:** Hurlstone Park. Complaint regarding noise, vibration and dust at the MSB site. The matter was investigated, and the Place Manager phoned stakeholders and confirmed dust mitigation is in place in accordance with the CEMP.
- 26/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Complaint regarding worker behaviour and worker parking in front of resident's property on Foord Avenue where bins are collected, inhibiting bin collection. An investigation found the stakeholder had become aggressive to the surveyor and the incident was raised with the Zero Harm safety team. After investigation the Place Manager contacted the stakeholder advising we will inform our workers of the parking impacts on local streets, and in respect to the stakeholder's issues relating to the behaviour of the surveyor, this matter has been escalated.
- 27/5/22: Hurlstone Park. Complaint regarding noise, dust, standard and OOH works and request for vibration monitor report.
