

Summary of Environmental Performance

The scope of works conducted during the reporting period was small and low risk. The project is winding down with most project scope complete, with mainly defects remaining. The ER is waiting on the completion of all scope and materials removal from laydown areas before handover and condition completion is finalised. Some laydown areas may be approved for ongoing use by SMC_BAC, though confirmation is pending.

It is noted that handover items may be on hold for longer than anticipated pending signing of the next contract for BAC. This is because some of the laydown areas may be handed over to BAC, which can't be confirmed/finalised until the contract is awarded.

ER Inspections

There were four ER inspections conducted by the ER in November (8/11/2022, 15/11/2022, 22/11/2022 and 29/11/2022). Key new actions/notes raised are summarised below, with actions/notes either closed out/ in the process of being closed out by SC:

<u>SW Corridor Traction Substation sites - ER Inspection #133 and #136</u> – 8/11/2022 [Tuesday; Rainfall (mm) recorded prior to inspection day – 0.0mm – 7/11 and 6/11 and 0.2mm on 5/11]and 29/11/2022 [Tuesday; Rainfall (mm) recorded prior to inspection day - 7.4mm on 28/11, 0.0mm on 27/11 and 26/11]:

- Canterbury TSS: Discussed minor housekeeping (removal of waste /redundant signage/ damaged sediment bags) required along section of batter on Hutton St side.
- Canterbury TSS: Note raised requesting photos of new coir logs installed as part of refreshing/maintenance of sediment controls at site access/egress.

<u>SMTF South and BPS works - ER Inspection #134</u> - 15/11/2022 [Tuesday; Rainfall (mm) recorded prior to inspection day - 31.2 mm on 14/11, 0.0mm on 13/11 and 12/11]:

- SMTF S Sydney Steel Road / Edinburgh Rd: Minor tagging observed on section of unbranded blue shade cloth installed along section of Sydney Steel Road and on hoarding (near Gate E1).
- SMTF S Gate 6 (Edinburgh Rd): Note raised requesting evidence of sweeper addressing some tracking at Gate 6 (Edinburgh Rd) as part of its routine schedule.
- Belmore St Joint Bay worksite Note raised and complaint recorded by SC (ID # 4219 15/11/2022) in relation to Community member approaching the ER inspection team during the inspection to raise concerns about the size of the site compound. Refer Complaint Section of this report for further detail, resolution and response to complainant.

Northern Sites and Barangaroo Laydown Area - ER Inspection #135 - 22/11/2022 [Tuesday; Rainfall (mm) recorded prior to inspection day - 0.0mm – 21/11, 0.8mm - 20/11 and 0.0mm 19/11]:

- CDS Logistics Shed and Storage Yard: Pedestrian walkway to Logistic Shed was noted to contain some rubbish that required removal (potentially wind-blown).
- CDS: Minor tagging observed on site hoarding at the time of the inspection.
- Barangaroo Laydown Area: Observed some dust from central portion of SC's laydown area during windy conditions. Discussed dust suppression measures in place at laydown area. SC requested for a water cart to be deployed, during the ER Inspection and stopping of works/plant movement due to windy conditions.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

<u>Two non-compliances raised against CSSI 7400 CoA C8 (CEMP and CEMP sub-plans must be implemented for the duration</u> of construction; CNVMP Table 20 – Source Controls) and reported to the ER during this reporting period and summarised below:

- 14/11/2022 NCR (against CoA C8) Surry Hills BPS (Belmore St) The nightshift security guard for the Belmore St joint bay was idling their light vehicle inside the compound in the early hours of 14/11/2022. This led to a complaint, which was reported on 14/11/2022. A second complaint was received at 6:51 pm on the evening of 14/11/2022, caused by the same security guard idling their vehicle again. Actions taken by SC security guard in question was removed from the Project; Subcontractor (Quickway) raised NCR and toolboxed crew on OOH requirements/procedures on 15/11/2022; additionally SC's Stakeholder Engagement Manager (SEM) personally attended Belmore St on 14/11/2022 around 8pm to speak to the security guard and vehicle idling requirements were reiterated by SC during pre-start toolbox meeting on 16/11/2022.
- 30/11/2022 NCR (against CoA C8)- Surry Hills BPS (Belmore St) On the evening of 29/11/2022, a traffic control light vehicle belonging to subcontractor (Quickway) was idling and had its signboard lights flashing while parked adjacent to the site compound in Belmore outside of standard construction hours. This led to a complaint by a nearby resident, who at 8pm stated that the vehicle had been idling with lights flashing for two hours. Root cause on investigation attributed to human error, change made during the day to shift handover times from 6pm/6am to 8pm/8am (to minimise impact on community), resulting in additional traffic controller having to come in to cover shift. Sub-contractor (Quickway) raised NCR and key actions taken/to be implemented by SC and sub-contractor (Quickway) are summarised below:
 - Shift changeover times changed from 6m-6pm to 8am-8pm for Quickway personnel performing security duties, to minimise potential for audible conversations in early morning hours
 - Assignment of consistent set of Quickway employees for monitoring Surry Hills BPS sites during OOH.
 - All staff attending to sign-on to 'Expected Behaviours' sheet to communicate and enforce standard of behaviour
 - SC SEM briefed all Quickway staff one on-one to educate /coach on how to deal with community members and reinforce requirements
 - SC SEM briefed full team on-site at prestart (2/12/22) on expected behaviours
 - Quickway discontinued services of previously engaged security company and has assumed internal responsibility for on-site security and traffic management
 - Quickway security and traffic control vehicles are to park in surrounding streets, avoiding Belmore St (TBC and parking arrangements to be advised) and enter Belmore St site via the Belmore Ln during OOH
 - WhatsApp group to be formed, specifically for OOH site monitoring for direct communication between Quickway management and site team
 - Furthermore, to manage the reduced number of parking spaces, Residents will be given the option to take up parking at the local Wilsons Carpark courtesy of the Project and also offered another round of one-off respite.

<u>Incidents</u> - There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A36 of SSI 8256. On 24/11/2022, one Class 3 event was reported to the ER/SM, DPE under A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 and EPA as courtesy at 3.23pm via the Pollution Hotline on 131 555 (reference number 17404), as summarised below:

24/11/2022- INC – Blues Point (Class 3 Event) - At approximately 2:02pm at the CSSI 7400 Line-wide Blues Point construction site, an excavator was moving spoil as part of the streetscaping and landscaping works. A very old (Sydney Water) pipe was burst during the works. The burst pipe may have occurred following the tracking of an excavator in the vicinity. It is assumed that the excavator movement has led to the pipe fracturing/shearing directly beneath the spigot. The pipe was in a dilapidated condition (probably over 100 years) and rusted, without the required depth of cover. Potable water from the broken pipe discharged through the work site and associated erosion and sedimentation controls (ESC) and via existing stormwater to outlet. Duration of the event was approximately 1 hour.
 Immediate Actions taken by SC – Additional ESC deployed immediately - including geofabric, sediment bags, coir log, poly and a diversion pipe to divert clean water directly to stormwater pit; Sydney Water were phoned immediately and requested to urgently attend site to shut off water (arrived around 3:00pm and water was shut off by 3:07pm). Water quality sample collected from the beach area at 3:45pm for lab analysis (sample result was 6.1 NTU) and at approximately 4:00pm, field readings were taken of water quality in Sydney Harbour at the ferry dock location (NTU recorded was between 7.4 and 9.5 NTU).

The water pipe was repaired and further actions raised to review all ESC to confirm controls are appropriate for future works and development of a hazard alert fact sheet, for wider distribution to other teams as a reminder/learning opportunity to check contingency measures are in place. Event was not considered to have caused material harm to the environment.

Complaints during this reporting period are summarised below:

- 8/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Consultation General; Traffic, Transport & Parking Complaint regarding
 insufficient notice received regarding the reopening of the joint bay at Belmore St and that more road parking had been
 removed than previously done before. Resident was informed that worker vehicles will park elsewhere and only
 essential vehicles will park on the street; site's footprint would be reduced to allow for more residential parking on the
 street and resident was requested to keep SEM informed about any further concerns around parking.
- 9/11/2022 -Surry Hills power upgrade -Property access Complaint regarding access to the front of the property (being renovated) made difficult because of the reopening of the joint bay pit at Belmore St. Summary update on further actions/resolution of complaint from 16/11/2022 SEM had further discussion with resident on-site and offered AA for the duration of the work (resident declined this offer). RO offered as a gesture of goodwill as a one-off to impacted Belmore St residents in recognition of continuing works; SEM still to hear confirmation from resident accepting RO.
- 10/11/2022 Chatswood Dive Site Noise and Vibration (OOH) Resident complained about noise overnight affecting their sleep and that she people on-site hand moving materials. SC investigated with team on-site and determined they were moving and clearing materials on -site (as per OOHWA). Workforce briefed to reinforce the need to keep noise to a minimum when undertaking all work, including the moving of materials
- 14/11/2022 2 x complaints (4.41 am and 6.51 pm from same complainant) Surry Hills power upgrade Noise and Vibration (OOHW)/Worker Behaviour Resident raised concerns about the noise from an idling ute within the construction compound at Belmore St (Surry Hills) at 4am in the morning. Same resident contacted the SEM directly (6.51 pm), regarding the same security guard returning to site leaving his ute's engine idling for a period of 40 minutes. In response to second complaint, SEM drove out to site to personally address the matter with the security guard. Refer Non -Compliance raised and reported above, including actions taken to address complaints.
- 14/11/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood)- Resident advised that a large tree branch was found in front of their house, blocking footpath. Resident saw big trucks parked on the street in the morning before tree was damaged, alleging trucks were related to SC work in the area. Site team could not confirm if SC's truck caused the damage as (no rego plate or description of vehicles provided) and in addition, considering strong winds at the time. Council was contacted and confirmed tree branch would be removed within 2 days and outcome conveyed to the residents.
- 15/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Cumulative Impacts Resident approached the ER inspection team during a
 routine inspection to raise concerns about the size of the site compound stating it is double the size compared to what
 it was when previously established. On further investigation by SC EM/SEM with Site Team, it was established that
 equipment storage was the reason the compound increased in size and the intent was to reduce footprint on the street
 and secure all equipment inside the compound safely. On 16/11/2022 compound size was reduced by the Site Team.
- 15/11/2022 Marrickville Dive Site & SMTF S Worker behaviour Complainant stated he was sprayed with water from a water truck while working on the corner of Edinburgh and Sydney Steel Rd. SC's Community Coordinator apologised to the complainant and explained the reason for the incident. Complainant thanked SC for follow up and accepted investigation outcome.
- 16/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Consultation (General) Resident complained that there had been a lack of
 communication on the reopening of the joint bay pit in Belmore St. Prior to works commencing, SC undertook two
 doorknocks with 'Sorry I missed You' flyers, a notification flyer sent to the entire community and a respite letter. SEM

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responded to the resident explaining that given how quickly the joint bay had to be reopened it necessitated short communication time frames. SEM apologised and reiterated that they were eligible to receive the one-off respite offer.

 22/11/2022 - Northern Connection (Chatswood) – Air Quality - Resident raised issue with dust in the air coming from SC's site (Valetta Ln site). Water spray cart arranged for the duration of work. SC apologised to the complainant and explained actions taken. The resident appreciated the prompt response.

In addition to the two complaints raised by complainant on 14/11/2022 re idling utes at Belmore St – Surry Hills, below three complaints were also raised by the same complainant:

- 25/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Safety Construction Resident videoed Belmore St construction site compound from their home and saw a worker standing under the arm of a digger as it was shifting sand from the back of a light truck into the joint bay pit. Video footage was reviewed by SC and briefing taken on the ground. It was established there was no failure to comply from a safety perspective. Site workers stopped work and were toolboxed around best safety practices on site and working around mobile plant. SEM conveyed this message back to the resident.
- 28/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Worker behaviour Resident raised concerns about a loud conversation at the site compound on Belmore St (around 6am Sunday morning). Site Supervisor confirmed that at that time, night shift security was swapping over with the day shift security on the Sunday and that was the only work ongoing. Site Supervisor committed to informing the contractors of the need to be mindful of residents and noise from loud conversations and would toolbox this matter on-site. SEM conveyed this message back to the resident
- 29/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Noise & Vibration (OOHW)/ worker behaviour Received sent video showing a traffic management ute (stationary) but running its engine and operating its flashing lights. This video was taken in the after-hours period, between 7.30-8pm but the resident indicated this behaviour had been ongoing for 2 hours. SEM was advised by the Site Supervisor at 9pm that the subcontractors were advised of the complaint and engine of the traffic management ute was shut off immediately. Refer Non -Compliance raised and reported above, including actions taken to address this complaint.

Complaints during this reporting period unrelated to SC/SM activities:

- 14/11/2022 Surry Hills power upgrade Consultation and Noise & Vibration (OOHW) Resident raised concerns over email regarding work ongoing at Albion St and believed this was part of SC's work. SC SEM provided an email response to complainant that work referred to was on Albion St and were being undertaken by the City of Sydney. Complaint unrelated to SC works.
- 17/11/2022 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Noise and Vibration (OOH) Resident complained about noise after hours and claimed it came from SC's site. On further review of site having little activity and being informed by the site personnel that Council was undertaking road works at the cnr of Pacific Hwy and Mowbray Rd; SEM informed the resident the work they heard during the afterhours was coming from road work by Council. They were encouraged to phone the Council and express their concerns to them. Complaint unrelated to SC works.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward

Key Points:

- All complaints received in reporting period are summarised above with two complaints unrelated to SC/SM activities.
- No complaints received from the Southwest Corridor works including from approved OOHWs in reporting period.
- Total of 9 complaints from Belmore St Surry Hills BPS worksite relating to Consultation General; Traffic, Transport & Parking; Property access; Noise / Worker Behaviour; Cumulative Impacts and Safety Construction. Of the 9 complaints, five complaints were from the same complainant.

- ER notes actions implemented/raised by the Contractor to address complaints and associated non-compliances from further complaint investigation (summarised within this report for completeness)

- ER also acknowledges SC taking into consideration ER/AA discussions /recommendations to address complaints. Specific examples include changing security company to address worker behaviour and offering alternative parking options to manage the reduced number of parking spaces

- Overall, the Project continues to generally perform well, with ER Inspections across this month identifying generally minor actions and improvements.
- The Project Team continue to be responsive to queries/comments raised in document reviews/discussions and recommendations made by the ER including complaint management (refer above) at Belmore St, Surry Hills BPS works.

Looking forward:

- Continue to monitor complaints at Surry Hills BPS worksites including Contractor's response/resolution to complaints
- Cap and containment remediation works at SMTF South site (in proposed internal access road area)

- Blues Point streetscaping/enhancement works continuing during Standard Construction Hours along Blues Point Road and Henry Lawson Avenue – scheduled between Jul 2022 with completion by Q4 2022.
- Surry Hills BPS Upgrade Essential cable replacement works (during Standard Construction Hours until mid-December 2022) between Belmore St and Ausgrid substation (including reopening Frog Hollow Reserve) and further testing. Based on outcome of future testing and commissioning, SC may need to return to Surry Hills at a later date.
- Surry Hills BPS Contingency OOHW for dewatering (weather dependant) Belmore St Joint Bay (until 17 Dec 2022). SC reports no OOHW dewatering undertaken till date.
- Canterbury to Campsie BPS works Works scheduled to recommence in January 2023. Contingency OOHW for dewatering (weather dependant) BPS joint bays with anticipated completion in mid- February 2023. SC reports no OOHW dewatering undertaken till date.



Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to complaints have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Complaints are discussed where relevant for each package below.

There were no incidents for any of the ISDs reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400. Where the ER is aware of minor events and non-compliances, these are as documented below.

There were no non-compliances/incident reported to the ER this period.

There were eight (8) complaints during the period:

- 4 November (22:48) Complaint from Kimpton Margot hotel regarding the noise from deliveries at PSS loading/unloading of bins and materials is very loud. Not happy that deliveries were taking place on a Friday night and there was noise generated from metal-on-metal. Upon investigation CPB informed Hotel they will work with Kimpton Margot to minimise noise and impact on the hotel and its guests.
- 4 November (23:31) Resident complained about noise from North site. Following investigation, CPBG determined that the source of the noise may have been cleaning areas on-site with a pressure washer completed before midnight CPB emailed the resident providing information on work hours, and the work that took place. CPM also provided a copy of the OOH community notification.
- 4 November (23:31) Park Regis complained about noise from North site. Following investigation, CPBG determined that the source of the noise may have been cleaning areas on-site with a pressure washer completed before midnight CPB provide update on noise and advised it would be completed by midnight (in the next 15 minutes). Security Guard appreciated the update and for investigating the source of the noise..
- 18 November (12:26) Resident advised of concrete splatter on balcony glass panels and metal façade. CPM texted the resident to advise that the concrete will be cleaned from her balcony ASAP, and texted the resident again to provide an update once cleaning was complete. Resident texted back thanking the CPM for actioning. CPB will increase physical measures on-site during OSD works to ensure concrete does not splatter onto a residential balcony.
- 19 November (7:50) Resident heard metal grinding noise at 7am this morning and wanted to provide feedback on Saturday work hours (for the OSD extended hours proposal). CPB called the resident immediately to advise that the

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team on-site are looking for the source of the noise. They are unsure if it is coming from the Pitt Street site or if it was coming from somewhere else. The resident said that he did not need a call back.

- 21 November (22:58) Resident complained with concerns with the scaffolding near her property and noise from site. workers talking and making noise near her property. CPB are investigating the construction noise and also the scaffolding near the resident's balcony. CPB spoke with the resident in the morning to discuss these points and advised that they are actioning it accordingly. CPM will provide the resident an update once she has investigated the resident's concerns. CPB sent through the company details as requested by resident.
- 23 November (23:03) Resident complained about excessive noise at PSS and would like to know when the noise will stop. Upon investigation CPB called the resident to advise that they are not doing any high noise activities, and the team are cleaning in the site. However, the Site Supervisor has said that there are other contractors working in Pitt Street doing some road/pavement works.
- 29 November (20:47) Resident complained about noise during the night and requested information detailing
 upcoming construction activities for the project.. Upon investigation CPB emailed the resident to provide details
 around utility installation works, work hours and confirmed details from last night's work. Also, detailed the mitigation
 measures in place for these OOH construction activities. CPM offered to add the resident onto their distribution list so
 he starts receiving weekly project email updates. CPM also attached a copy of the December 2022 overarching and
 out-of-hours notifications for the resident's reference.

Further complaint investigation confirmed no hammering/metal clashing activities being undertaken on-site and that a scaffold was moved prior to complaint being received which was in the way of the work area (under approved OOHWA). The scaffold was relocated once, and no further scaffolding works completed in this area for remainder of the shift. S&CLM called resident and apologised for the disturbance and reconfirmed hotel booking for this evening for utilities work.

Complaints unrelated to WL ISD/SM activities during reporting period:

24/11/2022 – Noise & Vibration – OOHW – resident called to complain about noise and whistling. Complaint
investigation noted fire alarm was going off in an adjacent apartment building on Cope St. Activities being undertaken
in South area was all electrical (under approved OOHWA). Site hive data also checked no noise recorded at the time of
call or within the next hour. S&CLM contracted resident to discuss the noise, explain what was happening on site last
night, provided a construction update and advised next week the site would be shut for a long week of respite.
Complaint deemed not related to WL activities.



ER Inspections

There was one inspection conducted by the ER in November 2022 (17/11/22). Issues raised and discussed were as follows:

- Stockpiles of builder's sand and imported tunnelling spoil were not covered, presenting a potential source of dust. A number of dust complaints have been made from a nearby resident so this issue should be monitored closely.
 Hardstand was covered with mud/dirt in some locations, including the area adjacent to the Shark's Fin, and the area
- leading to the Western Civil Pit. Excess spoil remained in one stockpile area adjacent to the stockpile had been removed. Accumulated material on top of the hardstand across the site poses a dust risk.
- Exposed disturbed areas remain a source of dust on the site.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for Barangaroo Station.

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period. There were two Class 3 incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER for the period:

- 7/11/22: Bedding sand in Zone 5 (The Cutaway) was being conditioned with water. A small quantity of sediment-laden water from the sand fines ran underneath the hoarding and onto the footpath around Nawi Cove. No water entered Sydney Harbour or the stormwater network. The water was observed by an INSW operative who notified the subcontractor working in the area, Ward Civil. The water and grey colouration was cleaned up with potable water and brooms, brushing it back into Zone 5. Sandbags were applied around the perimeter of Zone 5 as an extra level of control (previously only coir logs were in place).
- 8/11/2022: On Basement Level 5 (B5), an interface contractor installing PSDs noticed a small (~100ml) hydraulic oil leak from the head of a vacuum lifter. Work was ceased immediately, and the lifter was put out of service and the spill cleaned up with a spill kit. No oil was discharged off-site or into the surrounding environment.

There were no non-compliances reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period.

The ER is aware of three complaints reported during November 2022 related to BESIX Watpac works:

- ID 4188, 4/11/22 (reported 7/11/22): Complainant reported dust was all over the inside of her house and requested the site should be watered down. Dust controls were checked by the site team and the site was watered down on Saturday 5th November. Additional mitigation measures to reduce dust risk have been recommended by the ER and are awaiting implementation.
- ID 4216, 15/11/22 (reported 15/11/22): Complaint received regarding noise during OOHW to complete stormwater utility works on Hickson Road, and about dust from site during high winds. Advised the stakeholder that the site was being regularly watered down and offered to attend her property to sight the dust. Provided another copy of the notification which has already been previously provided by letterbox drop, door knock and email. Noise monitoring results were reviewed and found to be below predicted levels. Project team have previously offered to visit the resident's property to discuss concerns and undertake noise monitoring at the residence. This offer still stands.
- ID 4270, 27/11/22 (reported 28/11/22): Stakeholder emailed regarding noise from out of hours work on Sunday 27 November involving works to new stormwater drainage along Hickson Road, between 25 Hickson Road and Windmill Street Bridge. Noise monitoring results were reviewed and found to be below predicted levels.

It is noted that the above three complaints were received from the same complainant, located in a residence on Kent Street. The residence is raised above the project site and is not one of the nearest sensitive receivers to the project.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

The management of stockpiles and waste classification remained an ongoing issue and in November 2022, with the ER and Sydney Metro still awaiting records requested to verify compliance with waste classification and hazardous waste transport and disposal requirements, as well as compliance with the National Environmental Protection Measure (NEPM).

Conditions of approval and legislative requirements associated with site contamination and remediation are reportedly still in the process of being reviewed by the contractor's contamination consultant, though the results of the review and remediation approach has still not yet been communicated to Sydney Metro or the ER. This has been ongoing for many months.

Improvements in the communication of upcoming works from the contractor to the environment team, including the ER and Sydney Metro were ongoing throughout November 2022, with 3 and 4 weekly lookaheads provided regularly for review. Incidents that occurred during the period were generally low risk and appropriate mitigation measures have been implemented to prevent recurrence.

The BESIX Watpac Environment Manager has resigned and BESIX Watpac is in the process of recruiting a replacement, due to commence before the end of 2022.

- Contingency plan for dewatering of the western civil pit direct to harbour, and focus on the implementation of mitigation measures in the CEMP and Soil and Water Procedure
- Compliance with water quality parameters in the WDIA during discharge from the WTP
- Options considered for the discharge of B3 groundwater
- Dust control, particularly across the hardstand and stockpiles
- The transfer of water from Line Wide to BESIX Watpac from the surface and Level B6
- The management of works in zones with high-moderate archaeological potential and the reporting of unexpected finds
- The management, storage and disposal of coal tar and asbestos-contaminated spoil
- Completion of the Compliance Tracking Report (CTR) Q1 and Q2 2022.

ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted in November 2022 (4/11/22 and 28/11/22). Actions raised during the inspections were related to the following:

- Livingstone Road Bridge, Marrickville: Materials (including two portable toilets) were stored outside the rail corridor fence (but inside the project boundary); some materials were leaning against a tree.
- Ewart Street, Dulwich Hill: Litter (beer cartons and broken bottles) was observed at the bottom end of the site, likely to have been thrown over the fence.
- Melford Street Bridge, Hurlstone Park: Materials were stored very close to the brick wall of a resident's garage.
- Wairoa Street to Park Street, South Terrace: Shadecloth had come down in several locations along the boundary fence.

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Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with followup actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC, BEW and BAC. There was one non-compliance reported to the ER during the period:

 SMC-NCR-030, 8/11/2022: Pre-construction minor works approval (PCMWA) 004 was prepared for 3 scopes of low impact activities as part of the Bankstown and Additional Corridor Work package (BAC) tender. The approval had expired and Scope 2: Utility relocation and connection - Bankstown CSR Works occurred without a linking approval beyond the expiration date 30/10/2022. The works were 'low impact activity' as defined in the project's applicable planning approval. A non-conformance for the low impact activity is raised against the framework from under which the works commenced, i.e. the PCMWA.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A41 of SSI 7400.

There were no Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER during the period.

The ER is not aware of any complaints received during November 2022 related to the SMC_BEW_BAC works.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits. JHLOR conducted an Internal Environmental Audit on 8/11/2022.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Erosion and Sediment (ERSED) control remains a focus, particularly at site access points to reduce risk of dirty runoff and tracking. Site access points are generally well established and maintained throughout JHLOR PC areas along the Sydenham to Bankstown corridor. Erosion and Sediment Control Plans (ESCPs) are consistently reviewed and updated for new work areas and changed activities. The ESCPs demonstrate that ERSED issues have been reviewed in detail before applying required controls.

The BAC CEMP and Sub-plans have been approved by DPE, and works will be able to commence under the Plans once the PCCR is submitted to DPE. Sydney Metro is waiting on the finalisation of the Utility Management Strategy prior to submission.

Track slab works planned to be constructed during the Christmas Possession under BAC have been put on hold and most works planned have been cancelled due to uncertainty around ongoing industrial action. Tree removal within station precincts and compliance with tree numbers in the SPIR remains an ongoing focus, particularly in relation to upcoming security fencing design.

Review of proposed sites for use as ancillary facilities for BAC was ongoing during November.



Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for DCP and HBW.

The ER is aware of no non-compliances for the month and 12 complaints relating to DCP and HBW works. There were no incidents reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

The complaints are summarised as follows:

- There were three complaints from Dulwich Hill that were not related to Downer's work or Sydney Metro activities
- Three complaints from Wiley Park, two related to contractor parking and one for odour
- Six complaints from Hurlstone Park (five from one stakeholder); one raised for dust, one for consultation, one for property damage (evidence of damage pending), two for worker behaviour and one for parking.

Audits

No ER involvement was requested in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

The ER discussed potential environmental issues with Downer throughout the month, in particular preparation for ongoing rain events and the upcoming shutdown period over the New Year. Community and contractor construction fatigue is an ongoing issue for the project. As landscaping works commence, project environmental risks are reduced as areas are stabilised.

Looking forward:

- Continued implementation checks for CEMP and sub plans, focusing on ESC and community impacts
- Finalise Compliance Tracking Q2 2022 review and endorsement, commence Q3 2022 review.
- Coordination meetings with Sydney Metro and contractors for OOHW.
- Review site risks and evaluate ER surveillance frequency.
