Works conducted during the reporting period included:


- Metro Box Ongoing use of Platform 12 by the public. Waterproofing and tiling completed on Platform 15. Ongoing fit out activities for the Chillers and Ventilation Building – near complete. Ongoing fit out and commissioning of Metro Platform and other levels. Operation of permanent stormwater system.
- Central Walk Ongoing use of south side of the Central walk and some of the north-south concourse for public while works are completed on the northern side. Ongoing fit out of new escalators with escalator to north to Platforms 22-23 operating. Other fit out activities. Works within hoarded work zones on suburban Platforms 16-23 and platform surface excavation during rail possession weekends.
- Sydney Yard Small capacity WTP operating to treat some surface waters. Truck access; laydown. Reduced activities due to reduced works on the project.

- SMTF S Shade cloth to be re-attached along section of fence (Sydney Steel Rd) and where section is
 missing on fence.
- SMTF S General housekeeping (removal of waste/litter) required in laydown area where material had been removed recently and around pedestrian walkway (near Gate S2).
- SMTF S (adjacent to Stabling Yard) SC informed the ER that only one generator is being used at this stage for commissioning activities, during daytime hours only. Discussed that noise mats to be reinstalled appropriately in case OOH use is still planned. SC to confirm with Project Team and action accordingly.
- SMTF S Controlled overflow strategy discharge location (near Southern Dive) Replacement of damage bags/tidy up of area required.



There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256.

No minor Class 3 events reported to the ER, for this reporting period.

Complaints during this reporting period are summarised below:

- 01/03/2023 Dulwich Hill Substation Traffic, Transport & Parking- Resident complained that workers are using his driveway to do a three-point turn and that workers are driving onto his nature strip and damaging the grass.
- 04/03/2023 Northern Connection Noise & Vibration (OOHW)- Resident emailed stating Mowbray Rd work had severe impact on his sleep.
- 09/03/2023 Barangaroo Station Noise & Vibration (standard hours), Worker behaviour Resident complained about loud music coming from Hickson Road shaft, Barangaroo.
- 11/03/2023 Barangaroo Station Noise & Vibration (OOHW) Resident complained about hearing noise at 1:30am previous night (Friday 10th March) and again at 7:30am Saturday morning (11th March).
- 24/03/2023 Northern Connection Noise & Vibration (standard hours) Resident complaining about overall noise for the duration of work and queried why she is not provided with respite for all that work in the area.
- 24/03/2023 Campsie substation Noise & Vibration (standard hours), Respite &AA Resident emailed to complain of noise behind their property and ask for respite vouchers as compensation.
- 30/03/2023 Campsie to Canterbury power upgrade (LWW) Cumulative impacts, Property Access, Restoration – Stakeholder would like a concrete timeline of what's happening and why the joint bay has been opened so long and been reopened. Also frustrated that the join bays are opened and then they see no movement for weeks at a time. Also mentioned that house being built next door makes the impacts even more significant.

Complaints during this reporting period unrelated to SC/SM activities:

 17/03/2023 - Northern Connection (Chatswood)- Traffic, Transport & Park - Driver complained about an alleged SM truck, which swerved into his side of the road and almost caused an accident. Complaint further investigated and deemed not related to SC/SM activities.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward

- ER notes two OOH noise complaints received in reporting period one related to OOHW on Mowbray Rd (sewer/water connection) and the other related to SC OOH demobilisation works at Barangaroo on

one night (for which, AA/ER raised improving coordination for future OOHW between both Contractors to minimise potential for cumulative noise impacts).

- ER continues to closely monitor/review complaints from BPS worksites (one complaint received in reporting period)
- Overall, the Project continues to generally perform well, with ER Inspections across this month identifying generally minor actions and improvements.
- The Project Team continue to be responsive to queries/comments raised in document reviews/discussions and any recommendations made by the ER.







- One non-compliance reported to the ER during this reporting period and summarised below: NCR raised against CoA E36 following complaint relating to hours of work received on 24/03/2023 from a complainant on Berry St. Audio from noise monitoring at the site showed minor construction activities (formwork construction) commencing prior to 7am within the station site. NCR raised against CoA E36, as the current OOHWA for the South site does not permit works prior to 7am. Actions raised/being implemented include toolboxing construction personnel and sub-contractors to ensure that construction works do not commence prior to 7am and amendment of OOHWA to include additional area where no works are to occur 7-8am weekends, and past 10pm weeknights to manage OOHW noise impact at the South Site.



ER Inspections

There were two inspections conducted by the ER in March 2023 (9/03/23 & 23/03/23). Issues raised and discussed were as follows:

Incident on 26/2/2023 resulting in an overflow of the WTP bund was discussed. As was raised in an email from the ER to the contractor on 6/3/23, the draft incident report did not include information about the location, overland path, or volume of overflow - which was captured in a low point in the Shark's Fin. The incident report focused on a small leak in a valve which resulted in a small volume of water leaving the site in the direction of Nawi Cove.

BESIX Watpac has agreed to investigate why the WTP operator did not become aware of the issues with the WTP (which had stopped discharging and bund filling up, eventually overflowing, for 24 hours). It is understood the WTP compressor stopped working due to a power outage, the backup compressor had been unplugged and water was still being pumped to the WTP until security reported the issue/overflow.



Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period.

There was one Class 3 environmental incident reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station:

18/3/2023: During the week 13/3/23 to 17/3/23, the Temporary Water Treatment Plant (TWTP) was installed on site. This included installing the pipework to supply the untreated water from B3 to the TWTP, and the pipework between the TWTP and existing water treatment Plant (WTP). The connection of this pipework to the untreated water supply (cutover) was not planned to take place until the update of the CEMP and WQMP had been approved by Sydney Metro and the ER. There was a miscommunication between the team managing the approval of the CEMP and the team installing the TWTP understood that they could make the cutover to the TWTP and pump the water through the TWTP so long as the water was not chemically treated by the TWTP

before being pumped to the WTP for treatment as currently approved under the CEMP. The contractor is working to implement a number of controls and actions to prevent ongoing re-occurrences. There was one non-compliance (NC) reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period however this was raised against Sydney Metro. Refer to the Sydney Metro Retained Obligations chapter of this report.

Investigations for WTP incidents on 26th February and 18th March remain under investigation to determine whether there were any associated NCs.

The ER is aware of two complaints reported during March 2023 related to BESIX Watpac works:


- Complaint ID 4523 (Received 17/3/2023, Reported 22/3/2023): Complaint received in relation to noisy night time jack hammering and request for compensation and noise monitoring. A review of the schedule of works for that night showed no jack hammering was undertaken and review of noise monitoring data demonstrated noise levels were below those predicted in OOHW-012 for HV works on Hickson Road. Noisy works under the OOH were not scheduled after midnight. An email response was provided to the resident after phone contact was unsuccessful after several attempts.
- Complaint ID 4500 (Received 9/3/2023, Reported 10/3/2023): A noise complaint was received during out-of-hours work to install high voltage infrastructure along Hickson Road under OOHW-012. Discussion with the environment team determined the noise source was likely to have come from the replacement of road plates and demobilisation. BESIX Watpac will investigate options with the subcontractor, to help mitigate the noise impacts when packing up site at the end of the shift.
- Complaint ID 4562 (Received 28/3/2023, Reported 28/3/2023): Repeat complaint re noise coming from the southern end of the site. BESIX current works under OOH-012 are at the northern end of the site. Lendlease has been contacted to discuss current works at the southern end of the site, which appears to be the likely source.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A41 of SSI 7400.

There were no Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER during the period.

The ER is not aware of any complaints received during March 2023 related to the SMC works.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks on site are generally low and limited to possessions.

Tree removal within station precincts and compliance with tree numbers in the SPIR remains an ongoing focus, particularly in relation to security fencing design. The scope and details for construction of this element is also pending.

ER Inspections

Three ER inspections were conducted for MCL on 1, 15 and 29 March 2023. Issues raised during the inspections included:

Marrickville:

- MSB Scouring of landscaped mulch had occurred after several rain events and maintenance of the ESC was required. HSEJV updated all controls and directed water through sediment controls.
- Closure of Station Street had occurred without appropriate permits in place. This was raised as NCR-047.
- Station street A block saw was operating without appropriate noise mitigation, HSEJV installed noise blankets during the inspection.

Canterbury:

 Charles Street Compound / MSB - Minor maintenance of ESC and clean-up of sediment was required. No tracking from site was noted.

Lakemba

- Maintenance of ESC It was noted that clean water was scouring DBG adjacent to the MSB. The ER suggested that controls be installed to redirect clean water from the work areas.
- Minor housekeeping (rubbish and laydown) was required.

Non-Compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for MCL.

The ER is aware of one new NCR for the month and two complaints relating to MCL works. There were no incidents for MCL reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

The NCR (NCR047) was for the unapproved closure of Station Street at Marrickville outside of possession periods.

The complaints are summarised as follows:

- One noise complaint from Canterbury that was not related to Sydney Metro activities.
- One complaint was received at Canterbury for lack of wet weather protection at the completed bus shelters and Platform 1 stairs. It was noted that the complaint was after a heavy storm event.

Discussions continued with Sydney Metro regarding the remaining contractor scope and identifying potential low-risk OOHW, as well as implementing Package 4 closeout procedures.


