- 28/08/2023 Dulwich Hill TSS (LWW) Noise & Vibration (Standard Hours) Resident called to complain about constant humming noise coming from Dulwich Hill substation. Advised noise is only an issue in her backyard, and proposed a higher fence could be built in her backyard to mitigate the noise.
- 30/08/2023 Dulwich Hill TSS (LWW) Consultation General; Noise & Vibration (Standard Hours/OOHW) Resident emailed to complain about humming noise from Dulwich Hill substation. Also asked why the substation was energised now, and why no notice was given to the community.

<u>Complaints unrelated to SC/SM activities during this reporting period are summarised below:</u> <u>August</u>

- 23/08/2023 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Noise and Vibration (OOHW) Resident complained about loud noise coming from rail corridor/lack of notification.
- 24/08/2023 Northern Connection (Chatswood) Two Complaints X Noise and Vibration (OOHW) -Residents complained about loud noise coming from rail corridor.

SC investigated and confirmed with Sydney Trains Enviro Line and North Sydney station staff that works were Sydney Trains related maintenance works. Above three complaints deemed not related to SM/SC activities.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward

Key Points:

- Three Project related complaints following Dulwich Hill TSS energisation on 23 August 2023 (noise from transformers operating). The Contractor has brought forward the post commissioning review/verification process with noise assessment undertaken by an external consultant on 30 August 2023. Report currently under draft and review to determine noise compliance and next steps. Residents to be notified of TSS energisation going forward.
- ER notes no complaints related to SC works in the SWC from OOHW during the WE09 Possession period.
- Overall, the Project continues to generally perform well, with ER Inspections across this month identifying generally minor actions and improvements.
- The Project Team continue to be responsive to queries/comments raised in document reviews/discussions and any recommendations (as appliable) made by the ER.







NC raised against CoA E36, as the OOHWA for the South site does not permit works past 3am. Toolbox completed with relevant personnel.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period.

There were no Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period, though one potential incident related to water quality discharge from the WTP remains under investigation.

There was one non-compliance (NC) reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period, and one potential NC (related to heritage) has been recommended to be reported, likely to occur in September 2023.

NC 15/8/2023: A local resident contacted the Sydney Metro Barangaroo complaint line approximately 5:40pm on 17/8/23 about the vehicle noise from the out of hours works that were occurring on 15/8/23 (under application OOHWA-020). Upon investigation it was determined that the 5 tonne G&K Excavator (G&K being a subcontractor to Ward Civil) operating during these works was not fitted with a non-tonal alarm (as specified in the OOHWA-020 and Sydney Metro CNVS) and was operating during the Out of Hours Period.

The ER is aware of three complaints received in August 2023 related to BESIX Watpac works:

 Complaint ID 4947 (Received 17/8/2023, Reported 18/8/2023): Resident called about tonal alarm use during out of hours works. Complainant lives in Towns Place and faces the site right next to the bridges



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and says he is being disturbed every night the works have been on, through the night. The plant in question has since had non-tonal alarms attached and the event has been raised as a NC.

- Complaint ID 4952 (Received 22/8/2023, Reported 22/8/2023): Resident called to enquire about the proposed duration of demolition works. At the time concrete demolition works were underway on the northern part of Hickson Road near the former acoustic shed. Intermittent jack hammering will occur during the day to at least the end of August. The resident was offered ear plugs which he declined.
- Complaint ID 4963 (Received 24/8/2023, Reported 25/8/2023): Resident called to complain about disturbed sleep during OOHWA-020. No further details were able to be obtained from the complainant.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC.

There were two non-compliances reported to the ER during the period:

- SMC-NCR-040_Lakemba MSB_25 Aug 2023: Works undertaken outside of project boundary limits or the assessment footprint without approval. Caravan and ATF were moved outside of the approved Construction Compound (C15) and Project Boundary on Railway Parade, Lakemba. Once identified, the caravan and ATF was moved back inside the project boundary. A collective insight or equivalent will be delivered.
- SMC-NCR-042_Wilga concrete washout_27 Aug 2023: Chemical, oil or diesel spills or pollutant discharges to waterways between 10 100L. A concrete washout at Wilga Ave, Dulwich Hill was not set up correctly, leading to concrete laden water entering track drainage, but not migrating beyond. No material harm. Remediation was conducted by recovering slurry via sucker truck. NC was raised against ESCP not being implemented. A collective insight or equivalent will be delivered.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A41 of SSI 7400.



There were three Class 3 environmental incidents reported to the ER during the period:

- SMC-INC-039_Oil Spill Cant Compound_14 Aug 2023: A diesel leak from a 2 tonne tipper on to hard stand during rain event. Operator contacted enviro immediately, stopped tipper. Tipper re-inspected after 40 minutes; no leaked diesel observed. Volume: 5-10mL. Leaked area immediately covered with spill pad and due to the wet weather oil bund installed downstream. The controlled area was sprayed with 5L of Oil-gone 200. No environment harm. No sheen observed after Oil-gone 200 sprayed. No migration off site or sheen observed downstream. No sheen observed outside the compound.
- SMC-INC-041 Event 39230 Melford Oil_26 Aug 2023: A small oil spill occurred at the Melford Ave Hurlstone Park work area. The spill was remediated.
- SMC-INC-043 Event 39231 Melford diesel WE09_27 Aug 2023: 15L of diesel spilled from plant leaving a ~150m long trail on tracks/ballast. The spill was remediated with Oilgone.

The ER is aware of one complaint received in August 2023 related to the SMC works:

 Complaint ID 4938 (Received 15/8/2023, Reported 16/8/2023): Caller from Belmore complained about a constant machine noise in the rail corridor (Daytime). Upon investigation the noise could be attributed to the use of a vacuum truck for service location. The resident was called and the project explained the works would be complete by the end of the day.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks on site are generally low and limited to possessions – incidents were related to minor oil spills during possession and were considered unavoidable. JHLOR self-reported two non-compliances during the reporting period; their proactiveness should be commended.

No noise exceedances were identified during the WE09 Possession; No complaints related to JHLOR works; three minor Class 3 environmental incidents and two Non-Compliances.

The Q1/Q2 2023 Compliance Tracking Review (CTR) is up to date.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Management of ERSED controls generally
- Management of noise during OOH Work, particularly the Sept/Oct Possession which is likely to include 24-Hrs track reconditioning (including tamping) in many locations along the corridor, as well as ULX in at least 12 locations.
- Redesign to reduce tree impact for security fencing.
- Defining new scope for new packaged awarded and ensuring CEMP and Sub-plans remain updated to document associated risks.

The ER notes that the sites are generally stabilised with landscaping works and demobilisation ongoing during August. Site inspection frequency will be reduced to four weeks, with a focus on possession work. Looking forward:


