### 1 PHASE A - POWER ENABLING WORKS

The Environmental representatives for Phase A of Sydney Metro West are:

- Michael Woolley
- Greg Byrnes

Phase A - Power Enabling Works (PEW) is being delivered by Quickway.

Quickway are not required to hold an Environmental Protection Licence for these works.

## 1.1 Key Construction Activities During the Period

- Sites held by Quickway had been handed over to SM during the October 2022 reporting period.
- Works conducted by Quickway during the month of February 2023 comprised continuation of road
  restoration works in Darling Street; Merton Street; Robert Street and other streets in Rozelle. It is
  understood that as of the date of this report only line marking of some streets was still to be undertaken.

### 1.2 Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

• Line marking where road restoration works has been completed is planned in March 2023.

### 1.3 ER Inspections

No ER Inspections were conducted during the reporting period as road restoration works were nearly complete. No further ER Inspections are planned for Quickway works.

### 1.3.1 Photos

There were no ER Inspections held, therefore no photos were obtained during the reporting period.

## 1.4 Endorsed Documents

The following updated document were endorsed during the reporting period:

- OOHW-013(b) Final Road Restorations Various Locations (Mullens and Robert Street) Rev 6 dated 3-2-23;
- OOHW-014- Darling Street Restoration Works (Rev 2.0) covering line marking works along Darling Street and Merton Street in February 2023.

### 1.5 Complaints

Based on weekly Sydney Metro Complaint Registers provided, no complaints relating to PEW activities were reported during the month.

It is understood that some property damage claims are currently being reviewed by Sydney Metro.

## 1.6 Compliance

## 1.6.1 Incidents

No incidents were reported as per A43 of the Conditions of Approval for SSI 10038 for works conducted under the project approval during the reporting period.

## 1.6.2 Non-compliance

No Non-Compliance Reports (NCRs) were issued by the Contractor during the reporting period. No events were observed by the ER that were formally determined to represent a non-compliance.

## 1.6.3 Audits

No audits were conducted during the reporting period.

## 1.7 Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

Nil, given works completed except for line marking.

### 2 PHASE B - CENTRAL TUNNELLING PACKAGE

The Environmental representatives for Phase B of Sydney Metro West are:

- Michael Woolley
- Jo Robertson

Phase B – Central Tunnelling Package (CTP) is being delivered by Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV). Phase B of Sydney Metro West has been further broken into:

- Phase B1: Civil works
- Phase B2: Tunnelling works

The AFJV hold EPL 21610 for this Phase of works. Activities defined as Phase B2-Tunneling Works in the Staging Report for Metro West commenced during the November 2022 reporting period at Burwood North.

## 2.1 Key Construction Activities During the Period

#### The Bays

- Ongoing operation of the Construction WTP.
- Ongoing use of the haul road for WCX vehicles to access their site without going through the footprint of the station box.
- Ongoing Form Reo Pour (FRP) for spoil shed slab, footings and walls. Some of these works has been conducted OOHs.
- Ongoing excavation of the station box involving use of rock hammers. Removal of spoil from the station
  box using long reach excavators. Completion of drilling and stressing of rock anchors within the station
  box. Completion of excavation in the eastern end of the station box. Concrete slab construction and TBM
  rail construction in the eastern end of the station box to prepare for TBM assembly in the station box.
- Ongoing construction of the Segment Shed frame over the station box using multiple cranes.
- Site offices and compound in operation.
- Stockpiling and load out of spoil from site during extended work hours.
- Construction (trenching) of the TBM water supply pipeline along Robert Street using the former Quickway compound as a laydown area. Much of this work was OOHs.

## **Five Dock**

- West shaft: Construction of capping beams and general concreting works for slabs and footings. AFJV
  advised that they now plan to construct a noise wall around the site (as per the original acoustic shed),
  however do not plan to construct the high walls and roof of the shed. Further details are still to be
  provided. Commencement of excavation of the shaft.
- East Shaft: Completion of installation of panels on the shed walls and roof. Drilling and placement of rock anchors around the shaft. Ongoing excavation of the shaft and loading of trucks off site. Use of a house on Waterview Street adjacent the eastern shaft site leased from Council.
- Utilities works in local streets such as water pipe and Ausgrid works in Great North Road.

### **Burwood North**

- Shotcreting and wall support activities for the adit during evening period under EPL OOHWs permit. Lining
  of the tunnel.
- Ongoing excavation of the crossover cavern at the western end of the Station Box by road header.

- Ongoing excavation of the station box; stockpiling and load out off site of excavated materials. Wall support such as rock anchor installation. Ongoing construction of the acoustic shed over the station box including installation of acoustic panels.
- Use of truck egress to Parramatta Road.
- Operation of the Water Treatment Plant.
- Use of multi storev site offices.
- Various site establishment activities across the site.
- South Shaft: Completion of construction of piling pad using shale excavated from the north shaft. Piling activities with approximately half of the piles completed.

#### North Strathfield

- Ongoing piling activities on the upper side of the station box.
- Capping beam construction on the lower side of the station box.
- Utility and traffic related works in the vicinity of the station box and general area.
- Road alteration and pedestrian crossing works on Queen Street.
- Use of footpath on south side of Queen Street on recently constructed concrete pavement. Soon to be closed when pedestrian crossings are completed across Queen Street.
- Ongoing construction of concrete pavement for future loading area along Queen Street adjacent the site.

#### **Sydney Olympic Park**

- Ongoing excavation of the station box using a ripper on a dozer and excavators; drilling; installing and testing rock anchors; shotcreting of walls. Load out of spoil from site using truck and dogs.
- Use of site exit including weighbridge and wheel wash (as deemed to be required) to Figtree Drive. Heavy vehicles entering from Herb Elliot Av.
- Project Office Operating.

Various utility and other works out of hours at most sites.

#### 2.2 **Key Construction Activities Look Ahead**

- Ongoing activities as described above. Various OOHWs relating to services; road signs and signals, hoarding installation etc at many sites. Activities such as site investigations; utilities related works and site establishment.
- TBM water supply works in Rozelle along Robert St and other streets.
- Electrical works at kiosks on Herb Elliot Ave at SOP

#### 2.3 **ER Inspections**

There were four ER inspections conducted by the ER on each Thursday in February 2023, with the Bays being inspected weekly and other sites on an alternating basis. Key issues raised during the inspections included:

### The Bays:

- · ERSED control maintenance at the Spoil Shed construction area and under site sheds
- Adequacy of ERSED controls/capacity at the low point sump
- Repair washout section at WBPS drain and install adequate ERSED controls
- Secondary containment for chemicals at various locations

### **Five Dock:**

- HBI
- Inadequate containment and management of truck wheel wash water
- Maintenance and adequacy of ERSED controls at the low point of the site
- Road repair required outside East Shaft acoustic shed exit point
- Gap under hoarding in NE corner of east acoustic shed leading to noise leakage, particularly from generator in use in the shed in this corner
- Construction vehicles parking in No Stopping zones on Great North Road and Waterview Street.

### **Burwood North:**

- Secondary containment for chemicals
- Road repairs required on Burton and Loftus Streets
- Maintenance and adequacy of ERSED controls in area adjacent Parramatta Road
- Stabilisation of unsealed areas adjacent Parramatta Road
- Dust generation at the south shaft during construction of piling pads
- The potential for noise from scrubbers if they were to be used at night time without completion of the acoustic shed. It was understood from AFJV that the scrubber has not been used OOHs and that a revised DNVIS that considers use of the scrubber in the station box OOHs would be provided prior to the scrubber being used OOHs.

### **North Strathfield**

- Adequacy of ERSED controls/capacity at low point drain removal of mud slurry in this area
- Dust generation during dry periods

## SOP

Dust generation on roads near the site

### 2.5 Complaints

Based on a monthly Sydney Metro Complaint Registers provided for February 2023, there were 25 Complaints relating to AFJV activities reported during the month. Six of the complaints were related to the Burwood North site comprising: OOHWs (1); haulage routes (2); noise during standard hours (1); dust (1); and worker behaviour (1). Fifteen complaints at Five Dock related to: OOHWs (11), including related concerns about volume and nature of upcoming night works and related impacts; daytime noise; worker behaviour; lack of engagement; and vibration. Four complaints at North Strathfield related to: driveway access blocked (not related to AFJV works); worker parking; worker behaviour; and noise from OOHWs.

### 2.6 Compliance

#### 2.6.1 Incidents

No incidents considered to represent Incidents as defined under the Project Approval were reported to or observed by the ER.

One incident was reported to the ER under the SM Incident Reporting System for a diesel spill at the Bays site. AFJV reported that the spill was contained on site with the majority of the spill contained in the wheel wash.

## 2.6.2 Non-compliance and Potential Non Compliance

The following Non-Compliance Reports were provided to the ER for the reporting period:

- NCR 013: The report related to rock drilling using percussion techniques observed during the ER Inspection on 19<sup>th</sup> January at Burwood during the nominated respite period. This event has already been reported in the January ER Monthly Report.
- NCR 014: The report identified that spoil haulage trucks booked for spoil disposal from Burwood North and South used a haul route that was not approved for project haulage.
- NCR 015: The report identified that a loose road plate required emergency works to re-seat the plate at Robert Street (The Bays); and that the required process to notify of the emergency works was not followed under Condition D37a.

The ER has previously reviewed and made comments on the Six-Monthly Monitoring report for the period Jan-June 2022, noting that not all the required information as described in the relevant Monitoring Programs is considered to be contained in the monitoring report. AFJV has issued the Six-Monthly Monitoring Report for the July to December 2022 to DPE. This is currently under Sydney Metro and ER review.

ER actions have included parking of construction vehicles in No Stopping zones at Five Dock. AFJV has provided responses to this issue that are under review.

One complaint related to a street sweeper operating prior to 8:00am on a Saturday morning at the Five Dock site. AFJV have stated that use of the street sweeper at this time was conducted as part of spoil haulage activities. It is understood that AFJV will avoid use of the street sweeper prior to 8:00am on a Saturday morning.

It is understood there are ongoing communications within the project and also with DPE regarding the upload of documents required under the approval to be placed on the website under Condition B11. Currently there are various documents required under the approval that are yet to be placed on the project website.

#### 2.6.3 Audits

It is understood that the third Independent Environmental Audit (IEA) related to the CTP scope of works is still to be scheduled.



## 2.7 Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Dust generation at all sites during dry weather
- Dirt Tracking onto roads from all sites
- Water Management and ERSED Management specifically at Burwood North, as well as generally at the other sites
- Noise and Vibration management at Five Dock
- Construction Parking around various sites

### 3 PHASE C - EXISTING RAIL CORRIDOR ENABLING WORKS

The Environmental representatives for Phase C of Sydney Metro West are:

- Greg Byrnes
- Jo Robertson

Phase C – Existing Rail Corridor Works (Brownfield Works) is being delivered by Transport for Tomorrow (TfT).

Transport for Tomorrow are not required to have an EPL for these works.

## 3.1 Key Construction Activities During the Period

### Westmead:

- During the WE34 (18-19 Feb 2023) TfT progressed with the removal of aerial cables and poles within the rail corridor. This work required the closure of Alexandra Avenue from Bridge Street, Westmead to Pitt Street, Parramatta, power outages and bus relocations.
- Ongoing installation of low voltage containment and pulling and commissioning of cables on Westmead
  Platform Canopy and concourse. These works were conducted during night periods between 6pm and 7am
  during off-peak train times.

### **North Strathfield:**

- During the WE35 (25-26 Feb) TfT undertook the Pole 14 termination, installation of Pole 14A and 14S, installation and commissioning of cables between Pole 14 and 14A. These works required Traffic management along Queen Street and Gracemere Street
- Delivery of Pole 71S, excavation hole for Pole 71s and backfill.

### 3.2 Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

## Westmead:

- WE40 (1-2 April 2023): LV Commissioning and Omission closeout and hand over
- Ongoing installation of low voltage containment and pulling and commissioning of cables on Westmead Platform Canopy and concourse.

### **North Strathfield:**

 OOH WE38 (18-19 March 2023): Need M4 and Parramatta Rd occupancy, 11kV Jointing and Commissioning, Pole 71S installation and Connection, 11kV and 33kV Aerial removals, Pole Removals and Pole Modifications Poles 1-14

### 3.3 ER Inspections

One ER inspection was conducted in February 2023 (18/02/2023). This inspection was undertaken during OOH on being undertaken on Saturday night at Westmead. The ER Inspection focused on the implementation of the OOHW Permit – Westmead WE34. No actions were raised during the site inspection.

An ER Inspection is scheduled for the upcoming works at North Strathfield on the WE38 (18-19 March 2023).




Figure 3.1: Westmead Station - New GST installed

## 3.5 Complaints

Based on the complaints register provided to the ER, no complaints were received during the period related to the Existing Rail Corridor Enabling Works being undertaken by TfT.

### 3.6 Compliance

### 3.6.1 Incidents

No incidents were reported as per A43 of the Conditions of Approval for SSI 10038 for works conducted under the project approval during the reporting period.

## 3.6.2 Non-compliance

No Non-Compliance Reports (NCRs) were issued by the Contractor during the reporting period. No events were observed by the ER that were determined to represent a non-compliance.

## 3.6.3 Audits

No audits were conducted during the reporting period. The ER conducted Interim Compliance Review reported in October was ongoing.

## 3.7 Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

The TfT project team continues to be a highly responsive team and are proactively managing their environmental compliance and approvals.

Key items moving forward continue to remain include:

- Works moving towards completion across ongoing possessions.
- Implementation of the CEMP and other Construction documentation required under the SSI approval.
- Ongoing cumulative interface with AFJV and GLC at North Strathfield and Westmead, respectively.
- Management of OOH at Westmead and North Strathfield

## 4 PHASE F – WESTERN TUNNELLING PACKAGE

The Environmental Representatives for Phase F of Sydney Metro West are:

- Greg Byrnes
- Swathi Gowda

Phase F – Western Tunnelling Package (WTP) is being delivered by Gamuda Australia Laing O'Rourke Consortium (GLC).

GLC are constructing this Phase of Sydney metro West under EPL 21676.

### 4.1 Key Construction Activities During the Period

Construction activities are continuing at multiple sites across the WTP with the excavation of the TBM Launch box at Rosehill, excavation of station box at Westmead and Guide Wall construction at Parramatta. The following activities were undertaken at the Westmead, Parramatta, Rosehill, Clyde Dive and Clyde MSF sites during February 2023:

#### Westmead

- Station box piling works completed and excavation starting.
- The Parramatta to Westmead HV cable conduit installation is continuing outside approved construction hours under the EPL provisions.
- Establishment of long-term office and facilities
- Spoil Stockpile management including storage, classification and removal from site.

### **Parramatta**

- Archaeological investigations on the Church Street sides of the site
- Sewer relocation from inside the station box to outside continuing.
- Spoil Stockpile management including storage, classification and removal from site.
- D-wall and Bentonite Plant preparation including Bentonite Plant bunded area.
- Shared Access Road construction.

### **Clyde Dive**

- Haul road and pedestrian access construction, this involves earthworks and concrete pavement.
- Shaft excavation is complete with final shotcreting works continuing.
- Spoil management including movement around site, stockpiling, segregation and classification. Spoil is being transferred to the Clyde MSF by Moxy and crossing Unwin Street
- Acid Sulfate Soil storage and treatment areas
- Acoustic shed construction
- The construction of the noise wall between the ATC and Clyde Dive has been completed.

### Rosehill

- Excavation of TBM launch box.
- Spoil management including segregation, classification, and disposal. This includes the treatment of Acid Sulfate Soil
- Temporary Water Treatment Plant operation with discharge to Duck River
- Construction of Spoil Shed continuing.
- Long term water treatment plant mobilisation and assembly.

### Clyde MSF

- Water main and utilities trenching adjacent to the M4 on hold due to unexpected contamination find
- Piling for the water conveyance structure on both sides of Kay street and former Downer site.
- Spoil management including segregation, classification and disposal, including Acid Sulfate soil treatment.

## 4.2 Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

The key construction activities planned for March 2023 are similar to those listed in Section 4.1.

### 4.3 ER Inspections

Five ER inspections were conducted in February 2023 (1/02/2023, 8/02/2023, 15/2/2023, 22/2/2023 and 28/02/2023). A total of 115.6mm of rain fell during February 2023. Two rainfall events triggered additional site inspections (14/2/23 22.4mm and 21/2/2023 61mm). The ER Inspections following these events focused on the implementation of the PESCPs. In total 20 actions were raised across the WTP in February. The key issues were Acid Sulfate Soil management and implementation of PESCPs.

The actions and key issues raised at the inspections were:

- Rosehill The Rosehill site is being managed adequately, with spoil management especially ASS is
  continuing to be a focus area for GLC and the ER at the Rosehill site. Five actions were raised for Spoil
  management including ASS and one for chemical storage.
- **Clyde MSF** This site is being managed well with sediment controls being the key focus area for this site. Five actions raised, two for chemical storage and three for sediment controls.
- **Parramatta** This site is being managed well with no major environmental issues. Two actions were raised, one for spoil management and one for noisy plant.
- Westmead The Westmead site is being managed well with no actions raised.
- **Clyde Dive** This site is being managed well with sediment controls being the key focus area for this site. Six actions raised, four for sediment controls, one for tree protection and one request for noise monitoring.

#### 4.4 **Endorsed Documents**

No documents were endorsed by the ER during the reporting period.

#### 4.5 **Complaints**

Six complaints related to the WTP were provided to the ER during February 2023.

- Westmead Four complaints; one complaint (27/2/2023) related to a truck driving erratically on Parramatta Road with project identification. One complaint (22/2/2023) related to a trip hazard outside the site and two complaints regarding the HV works occurring out of hours. All complaints have been adequately addressed.
- **Clyde MSF** A complaint (6/2/2023) was received regarding flooding of a property on A'Beckett Creek. Following an investigation, a significant rain event occurred on the 31/2/2023 and the project and projects works have not impacted flooding. This complaint has been escalated to Sydney Metro
- WTP A complaint (8/2/2023) was received with regard to geotech drilling in Hassell Street Parramatta. This complaint was adequately investigated and closed out.

#### 4.6 Compliance

#### 4.6.1 Incidents

One incident was reported to the ER under the SM Incident Reporting System during February.

On the 2/2/2023 several skip bins and oil drums were identified being illegally dumped within the site premise and that some 44-gallon drums were leaking a thick oily substance in close proximity to a surface water drain. Spill clean-up material was immediately deployed to avoid off site pollution. The EPA and Parramatta City Council was notified.

#### 4.6.2 Non-compliance

Two Non-compliance occurred during the reporting period related to WTP works.

- - On the 8/2/2023 While completing the HV works along Park Parade, a GLC contractor has placed spoil
    material onto the surface of the adjacent park area. When the spoil was removed a small section of the
    surface in the park area was disturbed. Parramatta Park is a State significant heritage site. GLC engaged a
    heritage specialist to investigate and advised that no heritage impact occurred. This is a non-compliance
    with Section 7.2 of the Heritage Management Plan.
  - On the 20/2/2023 a concrete pour, supporting capping beam works, continued outside of standard construction hours. The concreting activities were being undertaken without an approved out of hours permit. This is a non-compliance with Section 6.4.3 of the Project's Noise and Vibration Management Plan and therefore also under Ministers Conditions of Approval (MCoA) D35 and D37(c)(i). No complaints related to this event were received by the ER.

## 4.6.3 Audits

No audits were undertaken during the reporting period.

## 4.7 Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

GLC are managing their environmental risk and compliance adequately. The ER inspections and compliance monitoring focused on the implementation of Progressive Erosion and Sediment Control Plans and ASS treatment and storage.

The core focus areas for the coming month are:

- Noise management, especially at Westmead and the Clyde Dive site
- Spoil management, especially the storage and stockpiling measures
- Acid Sulfate soil storage and treatment.

#### 5 PHASE G - EASTERN TUNNEL PACKAGE

The Sydney Metro West Eastern Tunnel Package is Stage 2 of the Sydney Metro West CSSI and is described as major civil construction works between The Bays and Sydney CBD, including station excavation at Pyrmont and Hunter Street and tunnel excavation between the Bays and Hunter Street. Stage 2 (SSI 19238057) was approved on the 24 August 2022.

The Environmental Representatives for the Sydney Metro West Eastern Tunnel Package are:

- Michael Woolley
- **Greg Byrnes**
- Jo Robertson

The Eastern Tunnelling Package (ETP) is being delivered by John Holland CPB Ghella Joint Venture (JCG) with the contract being awarded in November 2022.

JCG are in the process of applying for a project EPL.

#### 5.1 **Key Activities During the Period**

The JCG is currently working through the pre-construction project approval process and Low Impact Works (LIW) applications. Minor LIWs continued in February 2023 and comprised:

- archival recording
- **Pre-Construction Surveys**
- Investigations for the conduct of Geotechnical Boreholes
