There were no incidents for Line Wide reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256.

• No minor Class 3 events reported to the ER, for this reporting period.

One non-compliance was reported to the ER during the reporting period.

NCR-020 - Residents were not notified about the energisation of the Dulwich Hill TSS. Transformer noise at previously energised substations (Southern Dive and Artarmon TSS) has been inaudible at residential receiver locations. Corrective actions raised by SC included:

- Approved Out of Hours Permit in place (OOHW-318 Dulwich Hill Transformer Operation)

- SC is currently investigating permanent noise mitigation measures with the transformer manufacturer and the noise consultant. Further noise monitoring will be undertaken to ensure noise levels meet operational standards following the installation works. This information has been communicated to the impacted residents.

- Lessons learned from this incident with actions implemented during the energisation of Canterbury TSS. This included notification to residents and noise monitoring undertaken the following day of energising the TSS

One complaint was received during the period on 13/10/2023 - CDS (LWW) - Noise & Vibration (Standard Hours/OOHW) - Resident complained about very noisy works at Chatswood Dive Site.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward

Key Points:



The ER is aware of one non-compliance raised during the month and 10 complaints relating to Crows Nest ISD work. There were no incidents reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400.


There was one ER inspection on 11 October 2023.





Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period.

There was one Class 3 environmental incident reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period:

19/10/2023: Exceedances of the cyanide discharge criteria were reported in the May, July and Q2 2023 Water Quality Monitoring Reports. Elevated cyanide concentrations were also detected during water quality testing conducted during decommissioning of the Temporary WTP and commissioning of the WTP in its new location. An investigation was undertaken to determine whether the exceedances had the potential to cause material harm to the environment, and to confirm the incident classification and to inform an exceedance report as required by the water quality monitoring program. The investigation concluded that increased levels of cyanide detected in the WTP discharge were most likely due to changes to potassium permanganate dosing in the WTP. WSP prepared a memo which concluded that as no exceedances of the cyanide criteria were reported to be present within Nawi Cove or Sydney Harbour, the elevated cyanide concentrations did not present environmental harm to the receiving waters.

There was one non-compliance (NC) reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period:

 19/10/2023: Whilst collating the data required for the October 2022 – March 2023 Noise and Vibration Monitoring Report it was observed that the real time vibration monitor mounted inside 25 Hickson Road had ceased to transmit data to the sigicom infranet for up to a 5-month period. The vibration monitor was also overdue for a yearly service. Verification of compliance with CoA C11 was unable to be verified for vibration levels received at 25 Hickson Road, a heritage structure located adjacent to road works ongoing throughout the reporting period.

The ER is not aware of any complaints received in October 2023 related to BESIX Watpac works.



Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to the Department of Planning and Environment (DPE) daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow-up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for SMC.

There was one non-compliance reported to the ER during the period:

SMC NCR Unapproved Tamper OOHW Campsie 3 Oct 2023: A Non-Compliance with Condition E22 was raised for Out of Hours Work under an EPL without approval. At Campsie, re-railing OOHW was scheduled on 30/9/2023 nightshift. The associated tamping occurred ahead of schedule on the nightshift of 29/9/2023. Subsequently, a resident lodged a complaint on 3/10/2023. JHLOR Community and Environment team investigated after the complaint was received. The works were undertaken ahead of schedule and had not been approved in the OOHW application. The team have been reminded that night work in the area is not permitted unless an assessment and notification has not been issued. An action was subsequently raised to the Track team to sign off on the requirements of the OOHW so that any changes in program are delivered in compliance with the OOHW approval.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A36 of SSI 8256.

There was one Class 3 environmental incident reported to the ER during the period:

Oil Spill near Myrtle Street Marrickville_21 Oct 2023 (WE17): Hydraulic pipe burst on excavator attachment, spilling ~5-10L of hydraulic oil. Impacted ballast excavated to 50mm below surface and taken to Belmore Triangle for stockpiling and waste classification (SP80 +- 1m³). Actions closed.

The ER is aware of 15 complaints received in October 2023 related to the SMC works:

Complaint ID 5071 & 5072 (Received 29/9/2023, Reported 4/10/2023): Two general complaints were
received about noise (standard and OOH). The complaints were investigated and closed-out.

- Complaint ID 5073 (Received 30/9/2023, Reported 3/10/2023): Resident complaining of noise outside property at Canterbury. Noise modelling and OOHW plan confirmed that works were being conducted within standard hours of construction and in line with the construction noise and vibration management plan and EPL. The resident had been offered RO and AA for OOH works on 24/9 and 30/9.
- Complaint ID 5075 (Received 2/10/2023, Reported 3/10/2023): Complaint regarding noise from unscheduled OOH track work between Hurlstone Park and Canterbury stations. JHLORJV CRM phoned the resident to apologise and explained that due to the extreme heat yesterday there had been a change in work schedule which needed to be caught up so that trains could operate again by first service on Friday. Works were meant to be completed near the resident's house during standard hours but because of the heat experienced yesterday and forecast again for Tuesday the schedule was modified to ensure the safe hand back of track and the operation of the line by first service Friday. JHLORJV CRM also agreed to keep residents updated as to both the next few days of night works and as to if they would pass the resident's address during OOH and also if they would be impacted by the WE17 possession.
- Complaint ID 5076 (Received 2/10/2023, Reported 3/10/2023): Resident complained of oversized machinery being parked on the street at Redman Parade Belmore, making a beeping noise when reversed. JHLOR CRM spoke to resident and apologised for the noise and advised the resident that the loading and unloading of plant OOH would be spoken about in the next prestart meeting, reminding operators to be mindful when unloading in residential areas. Resident was happy with this outcome.
- Complaint ID 5079 & 5080 (Received 3/10/2023, Reported 4/10/2023): Residents complained of OOH noise in Canterbury and Campsie. The noise was due to a delay in works (tamping) due to extreme heat on Sunday 1 October and today, and that Sydney Metro's planned track maintenance work program has changed.
- Complaint ID 5083 (Received 3/10/2023, Reported 17/10/2023): Noise Complaint re out of hours work at Canterbury on 22,23 and 29 September. JHLORJV CRM advised resident that after investigating they could confirm that the noise experienced on 22,23 Sep was not related to works being conducted by JHLORJV. Noise impacts on 29 September were attributed to JHLORJV work, which was ahead of schedule, and not notified. A non-compliance with CoA E22 was raised as a result.
- Complaint ID 5117 (Received 21/10/2023, Reported 23/10/2023): Resident who lives adjacent to rail line at Dulwich Hill complained of noise impacts and asked about respite offer. JHLORJV CRM reviewed noise model and trigger list for properties and found resident had been advised of works and offered AA/RO for Saturday night and Sunday. Retrospectively offered the resident respite for Saturday night and Sunday.
- Complaint ID 5121, 5122, 5123 & 5124 (Received 22/10/2023, Reported 23/10/2023): Four OOH noise complaints were received from residents located in Hurlstone Park, near Railway Parade. JHLORJV CRM and Enviro advisor reviewed modelling and continuous attended monitoring which showed resident was not eligible for respite. As a one off, an offer of respite as a gesture of goodwill for the inconvenience caused was made.
- Complaint ID 5127 (Received 22/10/2023, Reported 24/10/2023): Resident of Railway St Hurlstone Park complained of disruption from OOH noise at night as part of a planned weekend possession. JHLORJV CRM reviewed noise model and trigger list and found resident had been advised of works and offered AA/RO for Saturday night and Sunday. Offer letter deliver to mailbox on 18 October by JHLORJV CRM. Retrospectively issued respite to the resident for Saturday night and Sunday.
- Complaint ID 5137 (Received 26/10/2023, Reported 27/10/2023): Resident of Railway St Hurlstone Park complained of disruption from OOH noise at night as part of a planned weekend possession and lack of communication for OOH work. Noise modelling and attended monitoring confirmed the resident was not eligible for respite and that monthly notification was letterboxed and emailed to the complainant. As a one off, an offer of respite as a gesture of goodwill for the inconvenience caused was made.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.



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Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks on site increased within the reporting period, mainly due to high impact out of hours works conducted during possessions. During the WE17 possession, high noise impact tamping was delayed due to extreme heat on the tracks. OOH work was also conducted in the vicinity of sensitive receivers at Hurlstone Park and Dulwich Hill, which contributed to a spike in the number of complaints received relating to OOH noise.

No noise exceedances are known to have been identified during OOH works, though one NC was raised due to tamping occurring ahead of schedule and therefore not notified (refer above).

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Management of ERSED controls generally.
- Management of noise during OOH Work ongoing during possessions.
- Management of tree impacts during construction of security fencing along the alignment.
- Defining new scope for new packaged awarded and ensuring CEMP and Sub-plans remain updated to document associated risks.
