Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

A very large fire occurred in the empty heritage building behind the Eastern Entrance across Randle Lane on 18 May 2023. For much of the reporting period there was no access to the Eastern Entrance. The building has since been demolished allowing access to the Eastern Entrance. Assessment of the damage and approaches to remedy the damage was ongoing at the end of the reporting period.

Two complaints were reported to have been received during the reporting period, included a complaint from a member of the public about workers smoking on Platform 14; and a noise complaint regarding noise from overnight works being undertaken during possession weekend on Platforms 22/23.

LOR reported an NCR for the real time noise monitor at Chalmers Street not operating during part of the weekend possession works on 24 June 2023.

No Incidents were reported that would trigger reporting under Condition A41 and no non-compliant events were reported or observed by the ER.

Audite

There were no audits conducted during the reporting period.

Summary of Environmental Performance

The project has been handed over to Sydney Trains or Sydney Metro except for the Eastern Entrance which is being assessed for damage after the fire of the adjacent building on 18 May. Good environmental performance was generally observed, noting only low risk issues identified during inspections.

Non-compliance/Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Sydney Metro has been providing summaries of complaints to DPIE daily and a summary to the ER. Responses to each complaint have been noted in each complaint report, with follow up actions often defined in revised reports. Key or repeat items of note are discussed below for the respective projects.

- The ER is not aware of any non-compliances. There were no incidents for TSOM reported to the ER under conditions A41 to A44 of SSI 7400 or A36 of SSI 8256.
- The following complaint was received: 9/06/2023- CSW LWW (Systems Connect) Noise and Vibration Standard hours. Resident reported a rumbling sound coming from underneath property, wanted to confirm if noise was related to train testing activity and if this was what could be expected during future operations. Complaint initially received by AW Edwards, who confirmed there were no site works at Crows Nest Station that could have impacted the property. Item was transferred to Systems Connect and MTR for consideration of LW or TSOM work. Systems Connect confirmed thatno LW works were taking place, as the exclusion zone was in place inside tunnel for train testing. MTR Stakeholder and Community Engagement Manager spoke withresident at 2.40pm. Resident advised the noise was heard every five minutes between 9am and 11.30am. She said it was similar to the noise heard when the tunnel boring machines were in use. MTR reviewed testing schedule against these details and confirmed that there were train movements underneath the property during the morning, but between 9am and 9:30am only. Movement was unlikely to generate the noise described. MTR Stakeholder and Community Engagement Manager advised the resident that further discussions would be carried out with the site team to rule out train movements as the source and to consider any possible alternatives. Resident will be contacted next week with an update.



Nil non-compliances (NC) were reported to the ER during this reporting period. No incidents were reported to the ER. Complaints during reporting period are summarised below:

- 13/06/2023 WL ISD Noise complaint (Standard Construction hours) Noise complaint regarding external façade works Resident suggested acoustic screens on the EWP. Also concerned about air quality regarding fumes from diesel generators powering lights along Cope Street. Due to the safety implications of obscuring vision while working at heights and the type of work installing acoustic screens would not be possible or reduce noise. S&CLM raised the generator complaint with the site's superintendent who will conduct an audit of the generators to determine if they are working correctly and arrange for any repairs, if required. The original day makers and generators installed were solar-powered flood lights, however they were ineffective and had to be changed. There is a temporary works plan in design to install electrical lights along cope street which will replace the day makers and diesel generators scheduled to take place over the next month. S&CLM called resident and to provide an update on the investigation. Residents receive prior notification of all standard works and what tools will be used to complete works in a project update distributed online. Investigation of the generators is ongoing, and resident was pleased that electric lighting would be installed to replace the generator-powered lights.
- 19/06/2023- WL ISD Noise & Vibration OOHW Noise complaint from a neighbouring resident regarding truck reversing tonal alarms becoming a nuisance during ongoing day works and night works. The residents stated that the alarms had been heard intermittently over the last week at night and at some times during the day, but the exact times or source of the alarms was not recorded/unknown. Superintendent who identified that EWPs for the façade works are fitted with non-tonal alarms which would be audible from neighbouring properties. As the complaint covered an unspecified timeframe the project team was unable to identify any specific plant or vehicle using tonal alarms. No noise exceedances were captured on the site's noise monitors. The Superintendents will hold toolbox talks to remind all contractors that plant and vehicles must use non-tonal safety alarms when reversing and to minimize reversing manoeuvres when possible.
- 24/06/2023 WL ISD Noise & Vibration OOHW Noise complaint regarding generators used to power day makers which provide lighting for Cope Street and the footpath at night. S&CLM raised issue with Superintendent who advised that the generators had recently undergone a routine maintenance inspection and were working efficiently. S&CLM confirmed that an alternative lighting solution is in progress which will reduce the number of generators and day makers required. Noise blankets are in place along the perimeter of Cope Street. Stakeholder requested not be contacted so no update was provided and the complaint has been closed.
- 24/06/2023 WL ISD Noise & Vibration Standard hours. Noise complaint from resident regarding beeping from elevated work platform (EWP) in use at Waterloo Metro site. S&CLM raised issue with Superintendent who arranged an audit of all EWPs to be completed. Any alarms found to benon-compliant tonal alarms will be changed, however, some alarms can not be altered as tonal beeping is required on some plant/situations for safety. Audit of EWP alarms is concluded that two contractors were operating EWPs with non-compliant tonal alarms, both have been updated to non-tonal alarms as of 27/06. S&CLM called resident to provide an update on the completed EWP audit and confirm that all non-complaint alarms had been updated. S&CLM apologized for the noise impacts and thanked resident for their patience. A toolbox talk will be held to remind all contractors to respect the local community and minimize construction impacts whenever possible.

28/6/2023: A 35T excavator was working within the Stockpile area in Zone 9 when a hydraulic hose on broke, spilling approximately 5L of fluid onto the ground. The spill was cleaned up using absorbent pads. The excavator was repaired and the used spill kit material was disposed of.

There was one non-compliance (NC) reported to the ER for Barangaroo Station for the period:

■ Date of NC: 23/5/2023, Date reported: 1/6/2023: NC raised by Sydney Metro Comms Team. An out of hours (OOH) complaint was made to the complaints 1800 phone number regarding construction noise at 6:45am on 23/5/23. The complaint response time was outside the required two-hour window as per the Community Consultation Strategy (CCS). It was later determined that the complaint was not related to the Barangaroo Station works.

- Station scope has recently been awarded (CEMP & Sub-plans updated and approved by ER as minor amendments under CoA A26(i)) and includes bracket installation, ULX rectification and secondary containment at Hurlstone Park, Canterbury and Lakemba.

Works will be Day only (including Sundays). Noise modelling is in progress but overall impact is expected to be low.

Works will include excavation in 3x Archaeological Management Zones (AMZ) – Marrickville, Belmore & Lakemba

Works will be within the vicinity of Threatened Ecological Communities (TECs) at Wiley Park and Punchbowl.

Ongoing pit dewatering, Stacey Street Bankstown to Wiley Park

ER Inspections

There was one ER inspection conducted in June 2023 (27/6/2023). There were no ER actions raised during the inspection. Inspections covered proposed locations for new JHLOR scope within station precincts, and proposed Minor Ancillary Facility (MAF) locations at Wiley Park (not proceeding), Belmore and Hurlstone Park for JHLOR PC of MTR MSB fit-out.

ER inspections continue at monthly intervals due to limited activities and low environmental risk, as determined by JHLOR and Sydney Metro in consultation with the ER.

Complaint ID 4755 (Received 2/6/2023, Reported 5/6/2023): Resident near JHLOR works at Livingstone Road, Marrickville asked about the duration of generator operating. The resident was advised works were schedule for completion by 23 June and noise barriers would be placed around the generator.

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks on site are generally low and limited to possessions.

Tree impact is being re-assessed by a review of security fencing alignment, and re-design where possible to reduce.

CEMP and Sub-plans are in the process of being reviewed and updated to remove reference to Bankstown and Additional Corridor (BAC) scope, and to include new scope involving JHLOR PC of MTR works at MSB locations, and additional minor scope within station precincts and surrounds. Potential heritage impacts associated with the works have been assessed (low to nil) and included in the updated Construction Heritage Management Plan (CHMP).

Upcoming works in environmentally sensitive areas (i.e. within AMZs and near TECs) have been identified and controls planned for implementation.

Noise impacts associated with the upcoming July Possession are expected to be minimal with the majority of work expected to be completed during the day.

ER Inspections

Two ER inspections were conducted for MCL on 7 and 21 June 2023. Issues raised during the inspections included:

Canterbury:

- Charles Street Compound / MSB Minor tracking of sediment onto Charles Street from the asphalt preparation works. Recommended implementing additional ESC and clean-up of sediment from the roadway.
- Hydroseeding of the embankments had been completed. It was recommended that HSEJV water the areas to promote growth.

Lakemba (drive by due to local event)

- Sediment was noted to have run offsite due to controls being removed, which collected in an adjacent stormwater pit from the Railway Pde storage area. HSEJV immediately organised a sucker truck to clean sediment to prevent potential environmental damage and reinstated controls. This was raised as an incident / NCR 051
- Incorrect storage of paint was noted. HSEJV were reminded to keep chemicals in appropriate storage areas (ie bunded, away from drainage)

The ER is aware of one new NCR for the month and zero complaints relating to MCL works. No incidents were reported to the ER under condition A36 of SSI 8256.

NCR051 was raised for Lakemba for removing sediment controls and hosing sediment-laden water offsite. HSEJV immediately arranged for a sucker truck to clean stormwater pits and clean the area, with ESC controls reinstated the same day. The site was tool-boxed on ESC and the incident.

Audits

No ER involvement was requested in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits.

ER Closing Comments and Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

The ER has continued to hold meetings with HSEJV and Sydney Metro to discuss the ongoing issues. Focus on ESC and OOH works. HSEJV had improved significantly regarding noise mitigation measures, with noise mats installed correctly where required at all sites.

The ER notes that the sites are becoming stabilised, therefore reducing environmental risk. It is expected that all sites will be inspected during Shutdown 6, with Marrickville then moving onto a monthly inspection due to the low risks associated with the landscaped site.
