- Metro Station Handed over to Sydney Metro. LOR in caretaker role until Operation.
- Central Walk Opened and handed over to Sydney Trains and in use by the public. Some defect works
 ongoing.
- Platforms 16 to 23 In use by Public. Some minor defect works ongoing.
- North-South Concourse Opened and handed over to Sydney Trains and in use by the public. Some minor defect works ongoing.
- Northern Concourse Opened and handed over to Sydney Trains and in use by the public. Some minor defect works ongoing.
- Eastern Entrance Opened to the general public and handed over to Sydney Trains. Ongoing defects work. Gate to Randle Lane remains closed.
- Sydney Yard Most of the Yard has now been taken over by other contractors working for Sydney Trains. Ongoing removal of plant and materials related to the Sydney Metro works by LOR. Ongoing removal of site sheds not required by Sydney Trains or their contractors with a few remaining which will be handed over to Sydney Trains. Some containers on-site storing various products. Most equipment and materials have been taken off-site or handed over to Sydney Trains contractors.
- Devonshire Street Tunnel In operation and used by commuters.
- ESR Concourse Works completed.
- Ghost Platforms (above ESR Platforms 24-25) Works completed.

Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

- Ongoing minor defects works and ongoing management and removal of plant and equipment from the Sydney Yard.
- Defects works are scheduled out to October 2024 at least, and will include OOHWs, often during weekend possessions when other contractors will also be working. The works will generally be minor in nature and include roof defects, drainage, tiling, painting, SYAB bridge defects and Chalmers Street Bicycle Stand. Another OOHWs Application has been issued for review for the works with much of the work understood to be low impact.

ER Inspections

Given the low level of works remaining and that the project has been handed over, no ER inspection was conducted in May 2024 and no further ER Inspections are planned or scheduled.

The last ER Inspection for Central Station in March confirmed that most of the area is now managed by other Sydney Trains Contractors, with minimal plant and equipment left on-site relating to Sydney Metro. A small number of site sheds were still being used intermittently by Sydney Metro and LOR personnel. Two actions were raised at this inspection have been closed out.

and verbal exchanges. Contractor addressed the issue with both parties, apologised to the complainant,
and assured her that the matter was brought to driver's manager's attention; the complainant was
satisfied with this response.

- It was noted that sub-contractors commenced concrete cutting without adequate noise installation in two locations during the inspection. AWE stopped the concrete cutting and installed noise mitigation. The sub-contractors were tool-boxed on noise mitigation measures.
- It was noted that an excavator had driven over a coir log and material tracked onto Clark Street. The
 material was in the process of being removed during the inspection and AWE spoke with site staff on
 removal of coir logs before entering the area. It was agreed that this would also be raised in the next

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prestart meetings as a lesson learnt.

- Pedestrian footpath access and vehicle access to driveways were maintained
- It was noted that traffic control was in place and managed traffic well. Two vehicles had tried to travel through Hume Street and it was noted that Google Maps was showing the bridge as open (previously listed as closed for construction) AWE arranged for online maps (Google, Waze and Apple) to be updated with the temporary closure during the inspection.
- Several cherry pickers were observed around Site C that were emitting tonal alarms when raising or lowering. AWE agreed to investigate if these could be swapped for less noisy alarms.







Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

There were no incidents for Barangaroo Station reported to the ER under condition A41 of SSI 7400 for the period.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks continue to reduce as excavations are filled in and more of the public domain and aboveground works near completion. ERSED remains a focus given the proximity of remaining works to the harbour.

Water treatment remains a focus as long as the WTP is managed by the Construction contractor. There is a risk that the Operator will not have appropriate systems in place to appropriately manage water quality risks prior to handover, e.g. the MTR Operational EMP is currently limited to a reference to the existing BESIX Watpac WDIA and Water Quality Monitoring Program.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas

- Management of ERSED controls generally.
- Management of noise during OOH Work.
- The completion of conditions and close-out of open actions.
- Verification of compliance with CoA E67 and implications of the station box remaining un-tanked post construction completion. Verification of groundwater quality and air quality within the station box for vapour intrusion potential under investigation.
- Handover of the WTP and the transfer of required information to the Operator and regulators to ensure achievement of water quality objectives (Condition E107)/minimisation of environmental risk ongoing.





Complaint ID 5528 & 5529 (Received 2/5/2024 & 3/5/2024): Resident adjacent to Belmore Triangle complained that works are being undertaken at unreasonable hours over the weekend and that respite offers are not adequate. Resident also stated that complaints aren't being managed correctly. No work was undertaken by JHLOR over the weekend (27-28 April) as such any disturbance caused was not related to Sydney Metro or its contractors.

A review of respite offered over the April Shutdown was conducted and found to be in accordance with the CNVS. SM has confirmed with JHLOR CLM that all complaints made by the complainant have been recorded and closed out as per complaint management protocol. JHLOR conducted an assessment to examine current noise levels in the area against existing modelling to determine if any additional measures are required to be implemented to reduce local noise impacts. As discussed with EPA, a wall of noise blankets has been established between the site access and the complainant's property.

The same resident complained the following day (3/5/2024) of trucks going beyond 10km speed limit at the site entry causing excessive noise from rumble grid, and noise from trucks crashing against the footpath. PO and loader operator confirmed that on 2 May access gate was unlocked at 6:50am with first truck radioed through after 7am. PO and loader operator confirmed that on 3 May access gate was unlocked at 6:50am and continuous real time monitor entrance to the triangle captured the first truck entering site at 6:55am. JHLORJV Environment manager reviewed the continuous monitor data. The resident is not considered high noise affected (LAeq15min >75dB) at the time of vehicle entry or any other stage throughout the day or nighttime period.

- Complaint ID 5589 (Received 27/5/2024): Belmore resident sent email to Sydney Metro (SM) that a truck entered the rail corridor via Belmore Triangle at 6:51am. Complainant also referenced that they did not receive an additional response from SM to their previous email, which was a response to a SM response to a previous complaint. SM investigated with JHLOR (contractor using that area). JHLOR team reviewed continuous noise monitor located at the site in question. Monitor detected a truck entering the worksite at 6:50am (27 May). JHLOR provided details that while the truck that entered the site was not completing a delivery or construction activity, the movement from this work vehicle cause disturbance to the resident. The vehicle entered site to facilitate access for trucks to commence spoil load out work onsite from 7am. JHLOR has committed to starting spoil load out from 7.30 to minimise reoccurrence of vehicle entry before 7am. Re not responding to previous email, SM interpreted from the complainant's comments around not wanting a back and forth to mean that they didn't want a further response.
- Complaint ID 5562 (Received 19/5/2024): Canterbury resident located near MSB complained of noise and vibration OOH. JHLORJV CRM attended site on 20 May and spoke to supervisor who advised that they had turned off the electrical isolation to the generator (attached to the mobile office caravan) and it only switched on again this morning, so the generator was not operational over the weekend. JHLORJV has spoken to Systems Connect CRM who advised that there is one generator operational which is being used to power the padmount which is included in the OOHW application. HSE PM has advised that their generator was isolated last week as per instruction from Sydney Metro and was not operational over the weekend. JHLORJV CPM noted that noise blankets are installed around both generators and the complainant's residence has multiple structures between the generators providing additional shielding from the noise made from these generators and is unlikely to be the source of the noise that the resident is experiencing. JHLORJV Enviro Manager suggested that noise maybe related to building services within the residents' own building.
- Complaint ID 5540 (Received 6/5/2024): Hurlstone Park resident adjacent to MSB complained of lights being left on OOH within the MSB area. DTI and JHLORJV teams resolved the issue on 7 May and JHLORJV CRM rang resident to apologise again and advise that it has now been resolved. CRM also advised resident that all systems to the building has now been handed over to JHLORJV and there as process in place for someone to attend site quickly and switch off lights should they be accidentally left on again.
- Complaint ID 5535 (Received 4/5/2024): Lakemba resident complained of noisy works being conducted OOH during WE45 possession and not being notified of works. JHLORJV CRM rang resident and apologised for the disruption. Explained that we were in a scheduled shutdown and works were being conducted around the clock and were notified for in the monthly notification and email reminder. JHLOR

CRM also made a discretionary respite offer to the resident in recognition that their property was just under the allowable noise levels that would normally trigger for a respite offer. Resident was appreciative.

- Complaint ID 5534 (Received 3/5/2024): Dulwich Hill resident complained about ongoing noise from works conducted inside and outside of standard hours of construction and value of respite voucher. Items mentioned suggest the resident could possibly be experiencing construction fatigue. JHLORJV CRM emailed resident to advise on how offers of respite are made and that the value of respite was set by SM. CRM also advised resident that they were eligible for respite for WE45 but were yet to respond to the offer. Resident thanked CRM and accepted the respite offer for WE45.
- Complaint ID 5536 (Received 5/5/2024): Lakemba resident complaining of noisy works being conducted overnight. JHLORJV CRM reviewed the location of the residents property against the closest work location which was over 130m from the closest worksite. JHLORJV CRM spoke to the resident and apologised for the disturbance caused and explained the works were due to the rail possession which was currently occurring. The resident complained about the length of time the project works were going on for, and it was clear that the resident is suffering from construction fatigue. After having a call with the resident he did understand why the works needed to occur and was appreciative of the call back.
- Complaint ID 5603 (Received 30/5/2024): Dulwich Hill resident complaining that placement of traffic control sign was restricting the resident's vehicle movement, parked on the street in front of their property. Traffic controllers advised that while existing location of the sign was appropriate, they were happy to reposition it if it meant the resident could access their car with more ease.

Environmental risks are consistent with out of hours works during possessions and maintaining compliance with the Tree Report process during security fence installation. Actions raised during ER inspections are closed-out within the agreed timeframe with useful supporting documentary evidence provided.

week, with initial noise monitoring within limits and respite measures in place. The resident was informed about the scope, timing, and proximity of the work, assured that nearby work would finish today, and will receive email updates on progress; the resident was satisfied with this response.

- 30/05/2024 - The EPA referred a report from Willoughby Council about sediment-laden waters entering Scotts Creek, traced back to the Chatswood Dive site. The Sydney Metro Environment Manager investigated, finding no evidence of rain or sediment and confirming that erosion controls were in place and functioning. The investigation results were shared with the EPA, which plans to visit the creek with the Council to identify the source, potentially including a visit to the Chatswood Dive site.
