

Monthly update –Westmead

25 July 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Gamuda Australia and Laing O'Rourke Consortium (GLC) has been awarded the contract to deliver nine kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between Westmead and Sydney Olympic Park, excavation for two new metro stations, a stabling and maintenance facility at Clyde and a precast facility at Eastern Creek.

Sydney Metro has engaged Quickway to relocate gas and telecommunications services around the future Westmead metro site.

Construction activities: August 2024

Tunnelling contractor, GLC will continue major construction at the Westmead metro station site during August. These activities will be carried out during standard construction hours:

- **Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 6pm**

Work will involve:

- Excavating the station box, cross over cavern, stub tunnels, cross passage and support work using excavators, rock hammers and front-end loaders.
- Installing rock bolts, formwork, concrete foundations and spraying shotcrete where excavation occurs.
- Surveying, installing and monitoring of survey prisms within local streets and around the site.
- Delivering and removing machinery, equipment, materials and spoil (excavated material).

Out-of-hours work

To minimise interruption to local traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers around the site, some work must be undertaken outside standard construction hours.

- Roadheader excavation and rock breaking is ongoing and is expected to be completed late August on the eastern and western sides of the station box and cavern, including stub tunnels and cross passage, as well as concrete foundations 24 hours a day, Monday to Sunday. Concrete deliveries to support these activities will be via the Hawkesbury Road access gate between 10pm and 7am. The next phase of work will involve intermittent jack hammering in sections until late 2024.
- Installing formwork and concrete lining of the tunnels and station box will continue 24 hours a day, Monday to Sunday until mid-2025.
- Surveying and installing, monitoring and maintaining survey devices within local streets and the rail corridor.
- Inspecting a sewer line on Alexandra Avenue, Park Parade, Park Avenue and at Parramatta Park.
- Delivering and removing oversized machinery, material and equipment via Hassall Street and Hawkesbury Road.

Quickway's out-of-hours trenching and pit installation work along Hawkesbury Road, Hassall Street and Bailey Street has now been completed. Telstra and other third-party telecommunication providers will be undertaking the next phases of utility works. These works will be completed in stages during out-of-hours and standard construction hours and will be notified separately.

Changes to traffic and pedestrian routes:

To facilitate access to work areas and safely operate machinery, there will be:

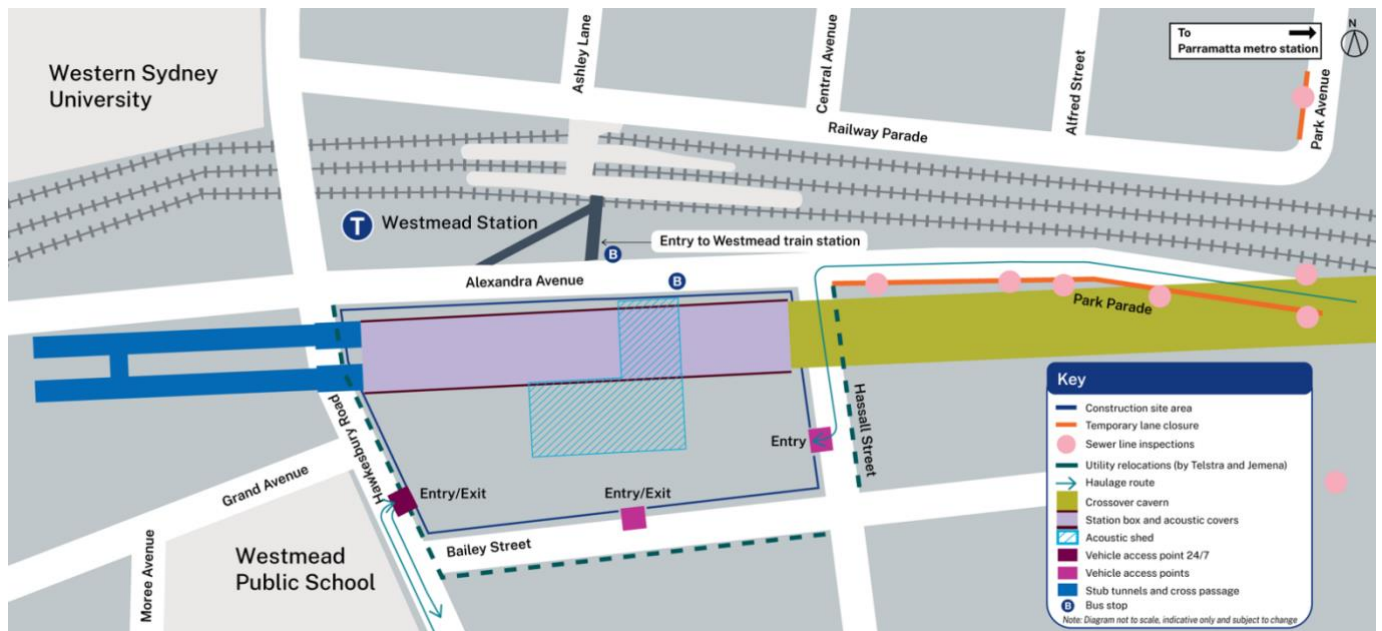
- Temporary lane closure to enable sewer line inspections on Park Parade and Park Avenue.
- Temporary signage and traffic control to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists with changes to traffic conditions.
- Access to public transport will be maintained.

What to expect:

- Noise blankets are used during night work where possible to minimise disturbance
- Lighting will be directed to the work areas and away from residential properties
- Noise, vibration and dust monitoring will be conducted.

Equipment used: Includes (but is not limited to) rock hammers, vacuum trucks, grinders, saws, excavators, concrete trucks and pumps, dozers, roadheaders, dust scrubbers, compressors, plate compactors, drilling rigs, spoil trucks, cranes, semi-trailers, loaders, dump trucks, tilt trays, tippers, generators, survey instruments, lighting towers, hand tools and light vehicles.
