



Monthly update - Sydney Olympic Park

23 August 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between the Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including a station at Sydney Olympic Park. Gamuda Australia and Laing O'Rourke Consortium (GLC) has been awarded the contract to deliver nine kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between Westmead and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate two new metro stations.

Construction activities: September 2024

The two tunnelling boring machines (TBMs) have now arrived from Clyde. They are being retrieved from the station box and transported back to Clyde, where they will be relaunched in the opposite direction towards Westmead. Another two TBMs are tunnelling from Rozelle and are expected to reach Sydney Olympic Park by late 2024. The work activities below will be carried out during standard construction hours:

Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 6pm

Work during September includes:

- Tunnel boring machine arrival and retrieval from the station box using a tower crane
- Installation of tunnel boring machine support infrastructure for breakthrough and post tunnelling activities
- Delivery and removal of plant, equipment and materials
- Groundwater well monitoring outside the site boundary (refer to map overleaf)
- Concrete pours and waterproofing inside the excavated station box and within the site boundary
- Removing concrete sections with excavators inside the station box and within the site boundary
- Spoil (excavated material) removal from inside the station box
- Substation relocation within the AFJV car park area on Figtree Drive, including vegetation removal
- Installation of ground anchors for tower crane footings
- Driveway reinstatement work on Herb Elliott Avenue
- Installing and monitoring of survey prisms within local streets and around the site.

Out-of-hours work

To minimise interruption to local traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers around the site, some work must be undertaken outside standard construction hours.

Out-of-hours work involves:

- Installing, cleaning and maintaining survey devices within local streets and the rail corridor.
- Delivery and removal of oversized machinery, equipment and spoil (excavated material) from site to occur 24
 hours a day, 7 days a week.

What to expect:


- There may be some noise from the work but we will try to minimise this as much as possible
- Property and business access will be maintained at all times

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes

- Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists at entry and exit points to the construction site to maintain two-way traffic flow
- For oversized deliveries and removal of equipment from site, a stop/slow traffic arrangement will be in effect on Herb Elliott Avenue from 8pm to 5am Sunday to Friday on selected nights
- Parking spaces have been temporarily removed on Herb Elliott Avenue until Thursday 12 September 2024
- Heavy vehicles will access the site during standard construction hours and out of hours using the approved haulage routes.

Equipment used: includes (but is not limited to) excavators, elevated work platforms, lighting towers, cranes, concrete pump, grout pump, compressors, grinders, rattle guns, welding equipment, water cart, sweeper truck, anchoring rig, CCTV truck, concrete saws, rock saw, road saw, generator, vacuum truck, tilt trays, scrubber fan, bobcats, forklifts, jack hammers, hand tools, trucks and light vehicles.
