Out-of-hours work notification – Barangaroo Station

August 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project

Services started in May 2019 in the city's North West with a train every four minutes in the peak. Metro rail will be extended into the CBD in 2024, with new metro railway stations at Crows Nest, Victoria Cross, Barangaroo, Martin Place, Gadigal and Waterloo and new metro platforms at Central, and then onto Bankstown in 2025.

BESIX Watpac is building the new Barangaroo Station, including delivering the station fit-out and associated landscaping and civil works, including the re-alignment of Hickson Road.

Systems Connect (an unincorporated joint venture between CPB Contractors and UGL Limited) is delivering line-wide work, which includes installing metro rail track, power systems, communications, and infrastructure to turn the excavated tunnels into a working railway between Chatswood and Sydenham.

Upcoming out-of-hours work (OOHW) to complete the road alignment, footpaths, bus stop, and bicycle lane along Hickson Road

Between Sunday 18 August, and Monday, 30 September, BESIX Watpac will finish the Hickson Road footpaths and road works under Dalgety and Windmill Street bridges, and the road surface to High Steps. This includes the southbound bus stop, eastern footpaths and bicycle lane under Dalgety Bridge, pedestrian crossing at 25 Hickson Road and laying the final asphalt surface to Hickson Road.

To complete the work, **Hickson Road will be closed overnight between Barton Street and Towns Place on six occasions.** The closures are necessary to remove temporary asphalt, lay the final asphalt on Hickson Road and the new bicycle lane, line mark the new road surface, and replace/remove hoarding.

The dates are Sunday 18 August, Sunday 25 August, Sunday 22 September, Monday 23 September, Sunday, 29 September and Monday 30 September, with the either one or two nights following each date as contingencies.

In late August/early September, the bus stop, eastern footpath under Dalgety Bridge, and pedestrian crossing at 25 Hickson Road will be open to the public. The bicycle lane and footpaths along the eastern side of Hickson Road underneath High Street will remain closed until other work in that location is complete in late 2024.

During the works, pedestrian access between Towns Place, Nawi Cove, and Barangaroo will remain open along the western side of Hickson Road.

What to expect

- Traffic management for the road closure diversion.
- Temporary lighting will be used to ensure a safe work site and will be directed away from properties.
- Equipment to be used will be a road profiler (noisy), forklift/telehandler, franna crane, lighting tower, line marking truck and other light vehicles, including for traffic control, and batterypowered hand tools.
- Pedestrian access will remain open at all times during the work.

• The work is expected to be noisy when the road profiler is removing existing asphalt, and moderate noise as forklifts or telehandlers remove and replace the hoarding. All noisy work will cease at midnight on all nights, and noise monitoring will be in place.

Location, timing and activities during the road closures

On the dates listed in this table, Hickson Road will be closed from Barton Street to Towns Place between 7pm and 5am the following day. A detour will be in place via Towns Place, Dalgety Road, Kent Street and Napoleon Street. Locations are provided on the map on page 3.

Our mitigation measures

- All vehicles will be turned off when not in use.
- Communication will be limited to radios only when moving/unloading materials, with no use of horns or loud radios.
- Trucks will avoid reversing onto and in site, where feasible.
- Non-tonal reversing alarms will be fitted to the plant and machinery.

Bus services

The new northbound and southbound bus stops will be closed during the out-of-hours work. Bus services 311, 324 and 325 will be rerouted via the Towns Place, Dalgety Road, Kent Street and Napoleon Street detour. There will be changes to bus stops, including temporary bus stops near the corner of Kent Street and High Street. These temporary bus stops will service the 311, 324 and 325 bus services. Road users may experience short delays. Directional signage will be in place for the safety of workers and the community. Please refer to the map below for details on the road closure, detour routes, and temporary bus stops.
