# Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, with a target travel time of about 20 minutes between the two centres.

Sydney Metro has been granted planning approval to construct twin underground rail tunnels between Westmead and Hunter Street in the Sydney CBD for Sydney Metro West. John Holland CPB Contractors Ghella Joint Venture (JCG) has been awarded the contract to deliver 3.5 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Hunter Street and excavate the Pyrmont and Hunter Street metro stations.

# **Temporary closure of Hunter Street**

Tower cranes will be disassembled at both the Hunter Street East and West sites following the completion of the building demolition at these locations. Due to busy weekday pedestrian and traffic conditions, we will disassemble the cranes over a continuous period **from 9pm Friday 11 October to 5am Monday 14 October 2024**.

During this work there will be a full road closure of Hunter Street between O'Connell and Bligh streets, and between George and Pitt streets to demobilize tower cranes at the Hunter Street East and West sites. Through access on Hamilton Street will remain open with a left turn only onto Hunter Street remaining open. Vehicles will also be able to turn right down Pitt Street via O'Connell Street. Motorists should use Elizabeth Street to travel south through Sydney CBD and use Bridge Street and Grosvenor Street to travel east and west across Sydney CBD during this time.

Parking will be removed from Bligh Street between Bent Street and Hunter Street to accommodate a temporary bus layover zone.

The road closures on Hunter Street will not impact bus routes in the CBD.

If our work is impacted by weather or site conditions, the closure date may change to **18 October to 21 October** or **25 October to 28 October.** We will notify you again if this is required.

# Changes to pedestrian routes


The footpath along Hunter Street adjacent to the Hunter Street East site will be closed, and the northern footpath between George Street and Hamilton Street will be reduced to accommodate the works. All other pedestrian routes will remain open.

#### Work will include

- Installation of traffic and pedestrian controls ahead of temporary road and footpath closures
- Traffic and pedestrian management at both Hunter Street East and West
- Installation of temporary signage, fencing and environmental controls
- Delivery of materials, plant and equipment on Hunter Street East and West
- Mobilisation of small and medium support cranes to disassemble tower cranes at Hunter Street East and West
- Disassemble of tower cranes at Hunter Street East and West
