



Monthly update - Sydney Olympic Park

24 November 2024

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between the Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including a station at Sydney Olympic Park. Gamuda Australia and Laing O'Rourke Consortium (GLC) has been awarded the contract to deliver nine kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between Westmead and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate two new metro stations.

Construction activities: December 2024

Work will continue within and around the Sydney Olympic Park metro station site during December, including:

- Tunnel boring machine retrieval from the station box using a tower crane and crawler crane
- Removal of tunnel boring machine services and supporting infrastructure
- Delivery and removal of plant, equipment and materials
- Groundwater well monitoring outside the site boundary (refer to map overleaf)
- Concrete pours, waterproofing and steelwork inside the station box and within the site boundary
- Removing concrete sections with excavators inside the station box and within the site boundary
- Installing and monitoring of survey prisms within local streets and around the site
- Installation of site facilities.

The above activities will be carried out during standard construction hours:

Monday to Friday 7am to 6pm and Saturday 8am to 6pm

Christmas shut down

While most of the project will shut down over the Christmas and New Year period, from **Friday 20 December 2024 to Monday 6 January 2025**, critical tunnelling related activities will continue to be carried out 24 hours a day, except on 25 and 26 December 2024 and 1 January 2025.

Out-of-hours work

To minimise interruption to local traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers around the site, some work must be undertaken outside standard construction hours.

The following works are scheduled to take place 24 hours a day, 7 days a week:

- Delivery and removal of oversized machinery, equipment and spoil (excavated material) from site. This
 includes the use of concrete trucks to support tunnel and cross passage work
- Waterproofing, concrete pours, installing steelwork and movement of spoil (excavated material) inside the station box
- Installing, cleaning and maintaining survey devices within local streets and the rail corridor.

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What to expect:

- There may be some noise from the work, but we will try to minimise this as much as possible
- Property and business access will be maintained at all times


Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes

To facilitate oversized machinery and equipment removal from site, the following traffic changes will be in effect:

- A number of parking spaces have been temporarily removed on Herb Elliott Avenue and will be reinstated on **Friday 20 December**
- Traffic management will be in place on Herb Elliott Avenue, Sarah Durack Avenue and at the Homebush Bay Drive intersection of the M4 Motorway, **between 8pm to 5am Monday to Friday**, on selected nights
- Heavy vehicles will access the site during standard construction hours and out-of-hours using the approved haulage routes
- Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists at entry and exit points to the construction site.

Equipment used: includes (but is not limited to) excavators, elevated work platforms, lighting towers, tower and crawler cranes, concrete pump, grout pump, compressors, grinders, rattle guns, welding equipment, water cart, sweeper truck, anchoring rig, CCTV truck, concrete saws, rock saw, road saw, generator, vacuum truck, tilt trays, scrubber fan, bobcats, forklifts, jack hammers, hand tools, trucks and light vehicles.
