Monthly update - The Bays, Rozelle

January 2025

Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including a station at The Bays.

John Holland CPB Contractors Ghella Joint Venture (JCG) has been awarded the contract to deliver 3.5 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Hunter Street and excavate the Pyrmont and Hunter Street metro stations.

Tunnelling and support activities will continue at The Bays Station site in January.

The Eastern Tunnelling Package's (ETP) second tunnel boring machine (TBM), Ruby will continue eastbound excavation under Glebe Island and onto Johnstons Bay.

The Central Tunnelling Package (CTP) will continue site demobilisation activities including dismantling the segment shed and workforce facilities. Hammering works are progressing well on the spoil shed slab and will continue until early 2025.

What work are we doing?

Throughout January, work for CTP will include:

- Tunnelling support activities
- Utility investigations and adjustments
- Tower crane in operation to assist with demobilisation activities
- Demobilising workforce facilities
- Demobilising the vertical conveyer
- Dismantling the segment shed

- Demobilising the tower crane
- Removing the spoil shed concrete slab
- Delivering and removing equipment, machinery, and materials to and from site.

Work for ETP will include:

- Tunnelling east from The Bays Station site under Glebe Island and onto Johnstons Bay
- Tunnelling support activities
- Continuing to install tunnelling facilities
- Installing steel and concreting
- Line marking, scaffolding, excavating, piling and installing ground support
- Utility work, geotechnical investigations, and instrumentation and monitoring work
- Delivering and removing equipment, machinery, and materials to and from site.

When and where we'll be working

We'll be working in and around our construction sites at The Bays. Standard construction hours for the site are Monday to Friday from 7am to 6pm and Saturdays from 8am to 6pm.

The following activities will occur 24 hours a day, 7 days per week:

- Tunnelling activities
- Delivering and removing materials, oversized machinery and equipment to and from site
- Utility work
- Low impact site establishment activities and surveying.

What to expect

- Temporary lane and road closures on Port Access Road, when required
- Worksite lighting
- Increased noise, vibration and dust





Presence of construction workers and vehicles, traffic controllers and traffic management.

Equipment used

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: trucks, trailers, light vehicles, tunnel boring machines, specialist tunnelling plant, watercarts, telehandlers, vacuum trucks, rollers, concrete trucks, concrete pumps, saw cutters, excavators, rock hammers, hand tools, lighting, cranes, elevated work platforms and drill rigs.

Managing impacts

Construction activities may generate increased noise and vibration and will be mitigated on site where possible. To manage impacts, we have:


- Installed acoustic sheds to minimise noise and dust impacts from tunnelling activities.
- Strict safety and environmental controls in place for all work activities.
- Scheduled work to minimise traffic impacts

- on local roads where possible.
- Designated parking for construction vehicles within The Bays site.
