Key Construction Activities - During the Period

- Project wide: pole installation for CCTV cameras at the rail corridor gates
- Security fence installation, including ongoing tree impact assessment, pruning, removal and ecologist supervision. Some sections adjacent to Threatened Ecological Communities (TECs) and threatened species, e.g. Breust Street ramp (Punchbowl), Urunga Parade (Punchbowl), South Terrace (Bankstown)
- Survey of trees in station precincts continued to verify compliance with the SPIR (potential for planning approval Modification).
- Archaeologist supervision within Archaeological Management Zones (AMZs), assessment of new areas
- Ongoing operation of site office caravans at selected Metro Services Buildings (MSBs)
- Stockpile management including waste classification, waste tracking, load-in / load-out, management of site accesses and truck routes
- Canterbury Compound: Site offices and amenities, fuel and gas storage; implementation of the weed management plan
- North Terrace Compound, Bankstown: Site offices and amenities, fuel and gas storage
- Campsie: Drainage behind Charles Street Mechanic's Workshop commenced, subject to Environmental Review
- Marrickville Station: Platform screen doors and mechanical gap fillers being installed
- Canterbury Station Lead paint removal, security fence, platform screen doors and mechanical gap fillers installation
- Belmore Station Security fence, platform screen doors and mechanical gap fillers installation
- Wiley Park: Security fence installation, subject to ongoing redesign to retain mature trees on the nature strip. Protection of heritage-listed stone garden bed edging. Ongoing updates to the Tree Report.
- Bankstown Station: Ongoing ballast reconditioning, tree protection and management, ongoing use of hardstand material storage compound, planning for further extension of laydown/work area on North Terrace.

Key Construction Activities Look Ahead

- Survey and defect inspections at all stations
- Preparation including noise modelling for upcoming possessions works on the following weekends: 30– 1 Dec 2024, 7-8 Dec 2024, 14-15 Dec 2024, 21-22 Dec 2024
- SWM3 sites will be closed from 23/12/2024 and reopening on 6/01/2025. This is a partial shutdown as parts of the corridor will remain partially open (areas to be confirmed)
- No dynamic train testing to continue from 23/12/2024 to 2/1/2025
- Bankstown Station works recommence from 2/1/2025
- Preparation of sites for Christmas Shutdown period including site security and environmental controls setup, pre-shutdown checklists to be completed by the contractor. Environmental Representative will be available on call during this period will be Maulik Bapodara 0433 494 595.

ER Inspections

There were two ER inspections conducted in the reporting period on 5 November and 19 November 2024. The following opportunities for improvement were raised:

- 1. Marrickville Station Improvement in erosion and sediment control required at the rail corridor entry/exit point.
- 2. Lakemba Station Ensure materials are not stored within drip line of trees.




Figure 3: Lakemba Station - 33kV cables removal in progress




Figure 11 – Canterbury Station - Lead paint removal in progress using laser and vacuum extraction






Figure 16 – Bankstown Station – Metro Service Building Concrete pour completed

Non-compliance/ Incidents or Repeat Complaints

Since commencement of City metro services passenger operations on Monday 19 August 2024, Sydney Metro is now providing summaries of CSW complaints on a weekly basis (was provided daily until 16 August 2024) to DPHI and ERs covering complaints related to remaining construction works. Complaints are discussed where relevant for each package below.

There were two non-compliances reported to the ER during the period.

- 1. 19/11/2024 Dulwich Hill Ewart Lane Unapproved out-of-hours delivery
- 2. 24/11/2024 Marrickville Unapproved tool (jack hammer) used in day out-of-hours at Marrickville Sewer for pile trimming.

There were no incidents reported to the ER under Condition A36 of SSI 8256:

There was one Class 3 environmental incident reported to the ER during the period:

1. 04/11/2024 – Canterbury – Heavy toolbox impacted suspended floor. Upon closer inspection it was determined that the failure was caused by rotten timber structures of the suspended floor.

There were eight complaints received in November 2024 related to the SWM3 works. There was a reduction in the number of noise complaint in this reporting period compared to the previous month:

- Four complaints related to out-of-hours noise
- One complaint related to flora and fauna
- One complaint regarding respite and alternative accommodation
- One complaint related to property damage and worker behaviour
- One complaint related to water and soil/worker behaviour

Audits

No ER involvement in audit activity including Independent Environmental Audits. Next independent audit for SWM3 planned for February 2025.

Summary of Environmental Performance

Environmental risks are consistent with out of hours works during possessions and maintaining compliance with the Tree Report during the security fence installation. Actions raised during ER inspections are closed-out within the agreed timeframe with useful supporting documentary evidence provided.

Looking Forward – Core Focus Areas



- Management of ERSED controls generally.
- Management of noise during out-of-hours work during possessions.
- Management of tree impacts during construction of security fencing along the alignment, and maintenance of the buffer zone.
- Compliance with the planning approval for the use of land outside the project boundary, including the establishment and use of ancillary facilities.

- Utility investigations and pavement resurfacing at various locations during standard construction hours and out-of-hours
- Minor vegetation removal works at Moreton St and Haldon Street overbridges, installation of erosion and sediment controls
- Catch deck installations at Livingstone Road
- Concrete Kelly block removal at King Georges Road, Wiley Park
- Non-bridge survey peg installation. Commencement of flora survey between Marrickville and Lakemba
- Design amendment to prevent removal SWM4 impact to high-value amenity trees at Punchbowl Station

- Site investigations using bore holes and surveys at various locations during standard construction hours
- Installation of piles, bore holes, traffic barriers, fencing and vegetation removal at various locations during standard construction hours and out-of-hours.

ER Inspections

 ER inspections are undertaken based on scope/risk levels of the activities. One ER inspection undertaken during November 2024 reporting period. No major works were being undertaken at the time of inspection. One minor issue related to graffiti was raised.
