



Monthly update - Burwood North

24 February 2025

Sydney Metro is Australia's biggest public transport project.

The NSW Government is delivering Sydney Metro West – a new underground metro railway which will double rail capacity between Parramatta and the Sydney CBD, link new communities to rail services and support employment growth and housing supply.

Acciona Ferrovial Joint Venture (AFJV) has been awarded the contract to deliver 11 kilometres of twin metro rail tunnels between The Bays and Sydney Olympic Park and excavate five new metro stations, including Burwood North Station.

Work during March

Work will continue within and around the northern station box during March. This will include:

- Delivery, construction and removal of reinforcement, waterproofing, formwork and concrete for the plenum structure, nozzle lining and floor blinding
- Removal and demobilisation of tunnel plant, materials and infrastructure
- Demobilisation of site facilities on both sites as well as construction infrastructure such as the gantry crane and road deck
- Waterproofing of the station box
- Installation of utilities in the station box
- Installation, adjustment and removal of fencing, scaffolding and hoarding
- Road and footpath repairs along Parramatta and Burwood roads
- Delivery and pick up of oversized equipment to and from the northern site
- Removal and adjustment of roadwork signage

This work will be carried out during standard construction hours:

Monday to Friday 7am – 6pm and Saturday 8am – 6pm

Equipment used

Equipment used for this work includes but is not limited to: trucks, light vehicles, excavator with hammer attachment, generators, watercarts, concrete trucks, compaction plate, concrete saws, bobcats, multi service vehicles, elevated work platforms, jack hammers, lighting towers, vacuum trucks, paving machines, concrete pumps and hand tools.

Work outside standard construction hours

As previously notified, AFJV is carrying out utility and CCTV work, preparation and completion of concrete pours, hoarding construction and maintenance, roadwork signage removal, as well as road and footpath repairs progressively on Burwood and Parramatta roads, Burton and Loftus streets and Neichs Lane. Some of this work, as well as oversize plant movements and deliveries, must be undertaken outside standard construction hours to minimise impacts on traffic and to ensure the safety of motorists, pedestrians and workers. Night work will be carried out on no more than two consecutive nights, no more than three nights per week and no more than ten nights per month at any one location.

This night work will continue to occur in the work area shown on the map overleaf between **6pm and 5am** on **Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday nights from Monday 3 March** until **Friday 4 April 2025.**

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Activities associated with tunnelling, such as concrete pours, cross passage construction, defect repairs, removal of temporary tunnelling infrastructure and installation of underline service crossings inside the tunnel, are approved for 24-hour operation, seven days a week. After 10pm deliveries and material removal will be undertaken using the site driveways on Parramatta Road only.

Changes to traffic, pedestrian and cyclist routes:

Traffic control will be in place to assist motorists, pedestrians and cyclists at entry and exit points to the construction site. The road restoration and utility work taking place in the surrounding streets will require some temporary footpath closures and road detours. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist motorists around this work. Material removal and delivery may be undertaken from the northern construction site using driveways located on Parramatta Road as well as Burton and Loftus streets between 7am and 10pm.
